I. Introduction

A. Background

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulates urban stormwater management under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). Urban stormwater collects in, flows through, and discharges from a “municipal separate storm sewer system” (MS4). Thus, EPA refers to the mechanism for regulated urban stormwater management as the “MS4 program.” The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) carries out the MS4 program at the state level and regulates urban stormwater management for qualifying public entities in Alabama. (The acronym “MS4” can also refer to such a public entity.)

In 2013, ADEM issued to the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) an individual MS4 permit (NPDES No. ALS000006) covering ALDOT’s MS4-applicable activities throughout Alabama. This MS4 permit was designed specifically for ALDOT and replaced regulatory coverage of ALDOT under MS4 permits issued previously. After a full five-year permit term and an administrative continuation, ADEM reissued this MS4 permit to ALDOT with some modifications on September 30, 2019. (Hereinafter, the 2019 version of the MS4 permit will be referred to as simply “the Permit.”) The Permit went into effect on October 1, 2019, and is intended to stay in effect for a term of five years (i.e., through September 30, 2024).

The Permit applies to areas of the state as specified by Permit item I.A. Requirements of the Permit largely fall under six minimum control measures: Structural Controls Operation, Public Education & Public Involvement (PEPI), Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination (IDDE), Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control, Post-Construction Stormwater Management, and Pollution Prevention / Good Housekeeping (PPGH). In addition, the Permit also contains specific MS4 monitoring requirements.

ALDOT developed a stormwater management program (SWMP) to address the requirements of the Permit and other MS4 stormwater management objectives. The document containing details of the SWMP is the “Stormwater Management Program Plan” (SWMPP). The SWMPP explains the ALDOT MS4 stormwater management activities to be conducted over the Permit term, the ALDOT parties associated with particular activities, the goals corresponding to the activities for the Permit term, and the intended timeframes for the completion of activities. The first version of the SWMPP applicable to the term of the Permit was submitted to ADEM on June 30, 2020. During Fiscal Year (FY) 2021, two revisions of the SWMPP (dated January 29, 2021, and April 27, 2021, respectively) were prepared. Thus, MS4-applicable activities performed by ALDOT during FY 2021 pertain to the June 2020 version, the January 2021 version, or the April 2021

version of the SWMPP, depending on when activities took place. However, the two revisions were minor as the ALDOT has not modified its SWMP in any substantial way since the development of the first SWMPP version, so the importance of an activity's applicability to a given SWMPP version is small. Another minor SWMPP revision (dated January 10, 2022) has been prepared; it will be in effect during FY 2022

B. Purpose of the Annual Report

ALDOT provides updates with respect to SWMPP implementation through annual reporting. As required by Permit item IV.A.1, ALDOT is to submit an annual report to ADEM by January 31 of each year the Permit is in effect. Each annual report is to cover the previous fiscal year (i.e., October 1 – September 30). Generally, the material included in the report is governed by items IV.A.4 and IV.B of the Permit.

This document is the annual report covering FY 2021 (i.e., October 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021). MS4-applicable stormwater management actions ALDOT performed during FY 2021 and the statuses of SWMPP-identified activities during FY 2021 are explained in Part II of this report. Part III of this report provides ALDOT's evaluation of its SWMP given actions performed and data collected through the end of FY 2021. In Part IV, the future direction of the SWMP is discussed; the discussion in part addresses modifications made to the SWMPP upon review of FY 2021 activities. Appendices that contain information to supplement Parts II through IV are included in this annual report as well. The appendix structure used in this report is designed to largely mirror that of the SWMPP in order to facilitate connectivity between the SWMPP and this report.

II. Actions Performed & Statuses of Activities during FY 2021

In this section, summaries of FY 2021 actions and statuses are presented for each SWMPP activity category. Emphasis is placed on certain actions and statuses rather than on others, as judged appropriate. A comprehensive list of SWMPP activities with corresponding FY 2021 actions and statuses is provided in Appendix A to supplement the discussion that follows. The list also contains expected tracking data for activities as well as references for finding additional information.

The COVID-19 pandemic continued for the entirety of FY 2021. ALDOT was able to carry out many of its planned FY 2021 MS4 program activities despite the pandemic, but some activities could not be conducted because of public health and employee safety concerns.

A. Stormwater Management Program Plan

ALDOT modified the SWMPP during FY 2021 over two revisions, as indicated above. Explanations of those modifications are provided in Part IV of this report.

The timely submission of this annual report will satisfy the annual report submission requirement for Calendar Year 2021. Annual reports for the Permit term to date have been submitted on time.

B. Structural Controls Operation

During FY 2021, field-testing of the post-construction stormwater management BMP inspection procedure and form began in anticipation of post-construction BMPs becoming officially fully operational in the near future. While there were no fully operational BMPs to add to the official post-construction BMP inventory, an unofficial inventory was developed for the purposes of field-testing; BMPs on the unofficial inventory will gradually migrate to the official inventory as they become fully operational. Two structural BMPs (detention ponds) were subject to the inspection method field-testing; outcomes of one of those field tests are presented in Appendix F. Section II.F below discusses post-construction stormwater management actions as well.

C. Public Education & Public Involvement

ALDOT continued its successful anti-litter public awareness campaign in FY 2021. During FY 2021, 103 radio stations and 24 television stations throughout Alabama broadcasted a campaign public service announcement (PSA) a total of approximately 10,000 times. Nine social media posts with PSA-related content were published on two platforms (Twitter and Facebook), leading to approximately 13,000 impressions in total. PSA coverage and demographic reach information can be found in Appendix C.

ALDOT also provided ongoing anti-litter public awareness for motorists by means of signage posted on ALDOT roadways throughout the state. During FY 2021, 755 anti-litter signs were active on ALDOT roadways across all ten ALDOT Areas. A breakdown of signs posted by ALDOT Area is given in Appendix C.

Also, with respect to signage, ALDOT in FY 2021 completed deployment of watershed boundary signs. In the end, 34 signs had been deployed on ALDOT roads at the boundaries of 10 important watersheds in Alabama. All 34 signs deployed were visually inspected during FY 2021. Photographs of all signs taken during inspections, grouped by watershed, can be found in Appendix C.

ALDOT maintained its agreements with Alabama People Against a Littered State (PALS) and Keep Alabama Beautiful (KALB) during FY 2021. ALDOT contributed \$ 294,855 to PALS and \$ 215,033 to KALB for FY 2021 activities. Activities conducted by PALS and KALB were in line with expectations set by contracts with ALDOT; Appendix C includes activity reports submitted by PALS and KALB that were reviewed by ALDOT. When ALDOT District personnel noted a litter issue in a particular area, ALDOT followed up with PALS and KALB to determine if litter control activities are being performed in that area. Regarding the PALS Adopt-a-Mile program specifically, 826 parties were active participants performing litter pickup on a total of 838.08 miles of roadway as of the end of FY 2021; a breakdown by ALDOT Region of roads adopted is provided in Appendix C.

Beyond addressing litter, ALDOT continued activities addressing the other target pollutants (i.e., sediment, herbicide, and chemicals and waste materials) as well during FY 2021. ALDOT carried out its Qualified Credentialed Inspector (QCI) training, vegetation management training, and typical good housekeeping training for support facility employees. Outcomes of these

training activities are discussed below in Section II.E and Section II.G, and Appendix C provides specific information related to those outcomes.

ALDOT participated in and facilitated education activities targeted for youth during FY 2021, though some activities in which ALDOT usually participates could not be held because of the COVID-19 pandemic. For instance, ALDOT could not participate in water festivals for schoolchildren as those events were not held. However, ALDOT personnel were able to give talks on stormwater/environmental topics at Auburn University in spite of pandemic constraints. More details are provided in Appendix C.

ALDOT's funding of stormwater management-related university research continued in FY 2021. Four research projects were actively supported during FY 2021. Appendix C gives a list of research projects funded by ALDOT during and prior to FY 2021; the total ALDOT funding amount for each supported project is provided.

ALDOT maintained significant interaction with the citizens in communities throughout Alabama during FY 2021. The ALDOT Web site underwent a major revision during FY 2021 so that the Web site would more effectively target the general public, would be more user-friendly, and would provide more clarity about ALDOT activities. The major revision included pages with stormwater/environmental content and the Environmental Concern Submission Form. As evidence of the more functional engaged provided by the revised Web site, the Environmental Concern Submission Form experienced a significant increase in citizen use once the Web site was revised. Forty-one environmental concerns were submitted by citizens using the Environmental Concern Submission Form during FY 2021, and three additional issues were reported through environmental contact means found on the ALDOT Web site. Details about the citizen reports and follow-up actions can be found in Appendix C.

ALDOT's use of social media to advance public awareness continued to grow during FY 2021. The earnest use of Twitter expanded to a total of four ALDOT Regions during FY 2021. The three older Region Twitter accounts continued to have followers numbering in the thousands. The Region Twitter accounts posted a total of at least four stormwater/environmental messages during FY 2021. Moreover, one Region began pilot-testing the use of a Facebook account. Appendix C provides more details about Region social media activities.

No community outreach group meetings were held during FY 2021 owing to the COVID-19 pandemic, but ALDOT was still able to engage at the local level in important ways. ALDOT continued collaboration with the Mobile Bay National Estuary Program. The ALDOT Southwest Region maintained the One Clean Mobile partnership with the City of Mobile; that partnership was incorporated into the more comprehensive Litter-Free Mobile Task Force established during FY 2021. Also, in the vein of supporting community anti-litter efforts, the ALDOT East Central Region participated in seven neighborhood cleanup events as well as in a tree planting event. In addition, ALDOT maintained cooperative maintenance agreements with the City of Huntsville, the City of Montgomery, and Etowah County so that those local authorities could perform litter pickup on ALDOT property. Additional details about ALDOT's local-level activities are given in Appendix C.

ALDOT continued to be an integral member of the Alabama Stormwater Association (ASA) in FY 2021 by maintaining a comprehensive contact list of Alabama MS4 and other stormwater professionals and by playing significant roles in facilitating two seminars (held virtually due to COVID-19) so that those professionals could gain technical knowledge and collaborate. Two ALDOT employees served on the ASA board of directors during FY 2021. ALDOT's involvement in ASA is further detailed in Appendix C.

ALDOT participated in the environmental-oriented efforts of several professional organizations during FY 2021. Employees represented ALDOT as members of International Erosion Control Association (IECA), the American Society of Civil Engineers, the Alabama Chapter of the Soil and Water Conservation Society, and other organizations. Of note, an ALDOT employee served as the IECA MS4 Management Subcommittee Chair, a member of the IECA Municipal Wet Weather Stormwater Conference planning committee, and the moderator of an IECA MS4 roundtable during FY 2021. ALDOT participation in professional organizations is further explained in Appendix C.

Also, with respect to professional collaboration, ALDOT began a dialogue with The Ray, a Georgia-based nonprofit aiming to promote and support roadside green infrastructure and other sustainability measures. ALDOT asked Auburn University to join the dialogue to allow for more robust, three-way collaboration. ALDOT will build on the dialogue established during FY 2021 and explore working with The Ray to further innovate ALDOT post-construction stormwater management and vegetation management practices. More details of the dialogue established are given in Appendix C.

Regarding additional education opportunities for ALDOT personnel, ALDOT employees participated in at least 17 professional educational events (e.g., conferences, seminars, workshops) during FY 2021. Appendix C provides a table with these events listed and the ALDOT attendance information for each event.

D. Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination

During FY 2021, ALDOT continued its review of the major outfall inventory and continued the major outfall dry-weather screening applicable to the Permit term. Outfalls on inventory in the Montgomery, Decatur, and Tuscaloosa MS4 areas as well as at the Central Office Complex / Montgomery Area Office / Montgomery District Office and at the Tuscaloosa Area Office / Tuscaloosa District Office were reviewed; no major outfalls were added to or removed from the inventory. All major outfalls reviewed were also screened. Two possible illicit discharge issues in all were noted during these screening efforts and were addressed in accordance with the SWMPP. A summary of inventory and screening activities relevant to the Permit can be found in Appendix D.

Two possible illicit discharges were reported by citizens using the Environmental Concern Submission Form during FY 2021. Details about the concern submissions can be found in the environmental concerns log given in Appendix C. Another five possible illicit discharges were discovered by ALDOT field personnel. All of these possible illicit discharges were addressed in accordance with the SWMPP.

E. Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control

In FY 2021, ALDOT continued to oversee Construction General Permit coverage and compliance as described in the SWMPP. There were 31 active, permitted construction projects in MS4 areas during FY 2021. Those projects are listed in a table provided in Appendix E.

ALDOT received one concern report relating to construction site stormwater runoff control during FY 2021, but that concern was not related to ALDOT construction activity. More details about the concern are given in the environmental concerns report log in Appendix C.

As noted in Section II.C above, QCI training was conducted during FY 2021. ALDOT facilitated QCI recertification for 392 employees and 167 other individuals over five virtual sessions as well as provided the means for 45 employees to obtain initial QCI certification. More information about QCI training is provided in Appendix C.

F. Post-Construction Stormwater Management

As noted above in Section II.B, field-testing of the post-construction stormwater management BMP inspection procedure and form began during FY 2021 in anticipation of post-construction BMPs becoming officially fully operational in the near future. While there were no fully operational BMPs to add to the official post-construction BMP inventory, an unofficial inventory was developed for the purposes of field-testing; BMPs on the unofficial inventory will gradually migrate to the official inventory as they become fully operational. Two detention ponds were subject to the inspection method field-testing; outcomes of one of those field tests are presented in Appendix F.

G. Pollution Prevention / Good Housekeeping

Eighteen support facilities were inspected during FY 2021, and the deficiencies noted during inspections were resolved or are in the process of resolution in accordance with facility SPCC Plans. The facility inspections performed and deficiencies observed during inspections are summarized in a table included in Appendix G. No significant revision of the ALDOT-wide support facility SPCC program was made during FY 2021, and no individual facility SPCC Plan was significantly revised.

With respect to support facility good housekeeping training, sessions covering SPCC, universal waste, GHS, and other related topics were conducted at ALDOT support facilities during FY 2021. Appendix C provides a table that indicates the dates of sessions held at specific support facilities for particular types of training along with the number of employees attending each session.

Regarding transportation facility PPGH, applicable maintenance activities (i.e., litter pickup, snow and ice control, drainage structure maintenance, erosion control, and herbicide treatment and surveillance) continued to be performed in manners intended to reduce the potential for negative stormwater runoff impacts during FY 2021. Of note, full-width litter pickup was performed on 19,055.56 shoulder miles throughout Alabama, and 3,777 instances of spot litter

pickup occurred as indicated by completed work reports. Other total activity work amounts are given in a table in Appendix G.

As noted above in Section II.C, vegetation management training continued throughout FY 2021. Ten sessions of the vegetation management training course were held for 278 ALDOT and 107 non-ALDOT participants in all. Details about individual vegetation management training course sessions are provided in a table in Appendix C. Agendas for this training (for Calendar Years 2020 and 2021) are also provided in Appendix C. Five vegetation management training newsletters were distributed during FY 2021. In addition, a total of 35 employees over five sessions held during FY 2021 participated in the “Review for Commercial Applicator Examination” course.

H. MS4 Monitoring

In FY 2021, ALDOT began field implementation of the visual observation strategy for MS4 monitoring developed in FY 2020. Two dry-weather observations and one wet-weather observation were conducted at all six selected monitoring locations in accordance with the visual observation strategy developed. The observation outcomes for the first year of implementation indicate that runoff flow paths on ALDOT property are well-vegetated overall and do not experience noteworthy erosion. Thus, the monitoring efforts have produced no evidence that ALDOT is a significant contributor to the pollution of waters for which sediment or turbidity is a pollutant of concern. More details about the MS4 monitoring activities conducted during FY 2021 are provided in Appendix H.

III. Evaluation of the Stormwater Management Program

While it is early in the Permit term, the proficiency that ALDOT has demonstrated in conducting MS4 activities during the first two years of the Permit (i.e., FY 2020 and FY 2021) indicates that ALDOT is experiencing sustained SWMP success which began in the previous MS4 permit term and has carried over to the current term. Progress made in implementing the SWMPP during FY 2021 has been encouraging, despite the ongoing, unavoidable obstacles resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

ADEM conducted a comprehensive audit of ALDOT’s SWMP during FY 2021. As of the writing of this annual report, ALDOT has not received any official assessment or rating information with respect to the audit from ADEM, but verbal feedback from ADEM representatives provided at the conclusion of the audit suggested that ALDOT’s SWMP would be rated very favorably and that few, in any, modifications of the ALDOT SWMPP would be requested. ALDOT considers this feedback further validation of the sustained success of the SWMP.

ALDOT’s evaluation of its MS4 program based on the accomplishments of the first two years of the Permit term follows.

A. Overall Program Compliance Status

Actions expected by either the Permit or the SWMPP to be performed during FY 2021 were performed by ALDOT when possible. The COVID-19 pandemic prevented some activities from taking place and reduced the amounts of other activities performed, but the pandemic caused no unmitigated compliance issues during FY 2021.

B. Major Findings Resulting from the Program

The ALDOT PEPI program continues to be robust. The anti-litter public awareness campaign, anti-litter signage, and watershed boundary signage are strategically targeting citizen motorists at a large scale. The accomplishments of PALS and KALB demonstrate the importance of ALDOT's ongoing support of external anti-litter campaigns to supplement ALDOT's own anti-litter efforts. ALDOT's online exposure and communication via social media with the public continue to increase. The major revision of the ALDOT Web site during FY 2021 was a significant step forward in terms of functional online connection with citizens, as evidenced by the remarkable uptick in citizens using the Environmental Concern Submission Form. ALDOT continues to connect with citizens and with other MS4s at the local level through partnerships such as the Litter-Free Mobile Task Force (formerly One Clean Mobile) and through participation in organizations like the Alabama Stormwater Association. The established QCI training and vegetation management training conducted by ALDOT continues to be set up to provide both employees and non-employees training well-regarded by the stormwater professional community.

Findings from environmental concerns submitted by citizens, major outfall screening, and good housekeeping on ALDOT property continue to indicate no major or widespread deficiencies in ALDOT MS4 stormwater management practices. The new visual observation strategy for MS4 monitoring, which began implementation during FY 2021, is, to date, providing additional support that ALDOT's stormwater management practices are sufficient in preventing pollutants of concern from entering natural waters.

C. Program Strengths & Weaknesses

Well-established, MS4-applicable activities continue to be noteworthy strengths of the ALDOT SWMP. In particular, education of employees, education of the public, involvement with the public, construction stormwater management, PPGH for transportation facilities, and IDDE-motivated major outfall inventory and screening are typically conducted in highly proficient manners and usually achieve expected outcomes or even outcomes beyond those that are required by the Permit. PPGH procedures for ALDOT support facilities continue to be implemented smoothly overall under the formalization that took place during the previous MS4 permit term.

Field-testing of the post-construction stormwater management BMP inspection procedures began in FY 2021, and the field-testing done suggested that the BMP inspection procedures are viable for assessing the condition of a given BMP and prescribing maintenance to improve the BMP's

performance. More testing is needed and will be conducted to determine if the inspection procedures are adequate for the broad spectrum of BMPs that will be fully operational in time.

The new visual observation strategy for MS4 monitoring showed promise during its first year of field implementation as well. ALDOT already sees the advantages of examining monitoring locations from a “big picture” perspective rather than trying to discern ALDOT’s contribution or lack of contribution to receiving water pollution based on noisy numerical data. ALDOT will continue to assess the viability of the new monitoring approach throughout the Permit term.

D. Overall Program Effectiveness

No evidence has emerged during the short time the Permit has been in effect to refute ALDOT’s prior assessment that its established SWMP practices are meeting MS4 regulatory requirements as well as ALDOT’s stormwater management objectives in a sustained manner. Since the SWMP has not changed substantially in recent years or over different MS4 permit terms, ALDOT is not expecting a different assessment as the Permit term advances, but ALDOT will continue to collect data in future years and draw reasonable conclusions, as appropriate.

IV. Future Direction of the Program

At this point in the Permit term, ALDOT has no reason to develop a major revision of the June 2020 version of the SWMPP given the sustained success of the ALDOT MS4 program. However, relatively minor SWMPP modifications are needed occasionally, which is why two revisions of the SWMPP were prepared during FY 2021 and another is being submitted with this annual report. Modifications made in the January 2021 revision of the SWMPP were discussed in the FY 2020 annual report. The SWMPP modifications made since the January 2021 revision are the following:

- updates of statuses of activities in light of FY 2021 outcomes,
- updates of ALDOT MS4 point-of-contact information because of personnel reassignments that occurred,
- discussion in Chapter 4 regarding the IDDE training ALDOT employees receive at the annual Maintenance Management Meeting,
- inclusion in Appendix D of the SWMPP of excerpts from a slideshow with IDDE training material presented at an annual Maintenance Management Meeting,
- minor editing of Chapter 5 to align the narrative with the Construction General Permit reissued in 2021,
- update of the Maintenance Performance Guidelines in Appendix G of the SWMPP,
- discussion in Chapter 8 concerning the visual monitoring form used in the new MS4 monitoring visual observation approach,

- inclusion in Appendix H of the SWMPP of the visual monitoring form, and
- corrections of any detected inadvertent misstatements, grammatical issues, and aesthetic issues.

ALDOT will modify the SWMPP again appropriately as the official results of the 2021 ADEM audit of the SWMP warrant and as other needs arise.

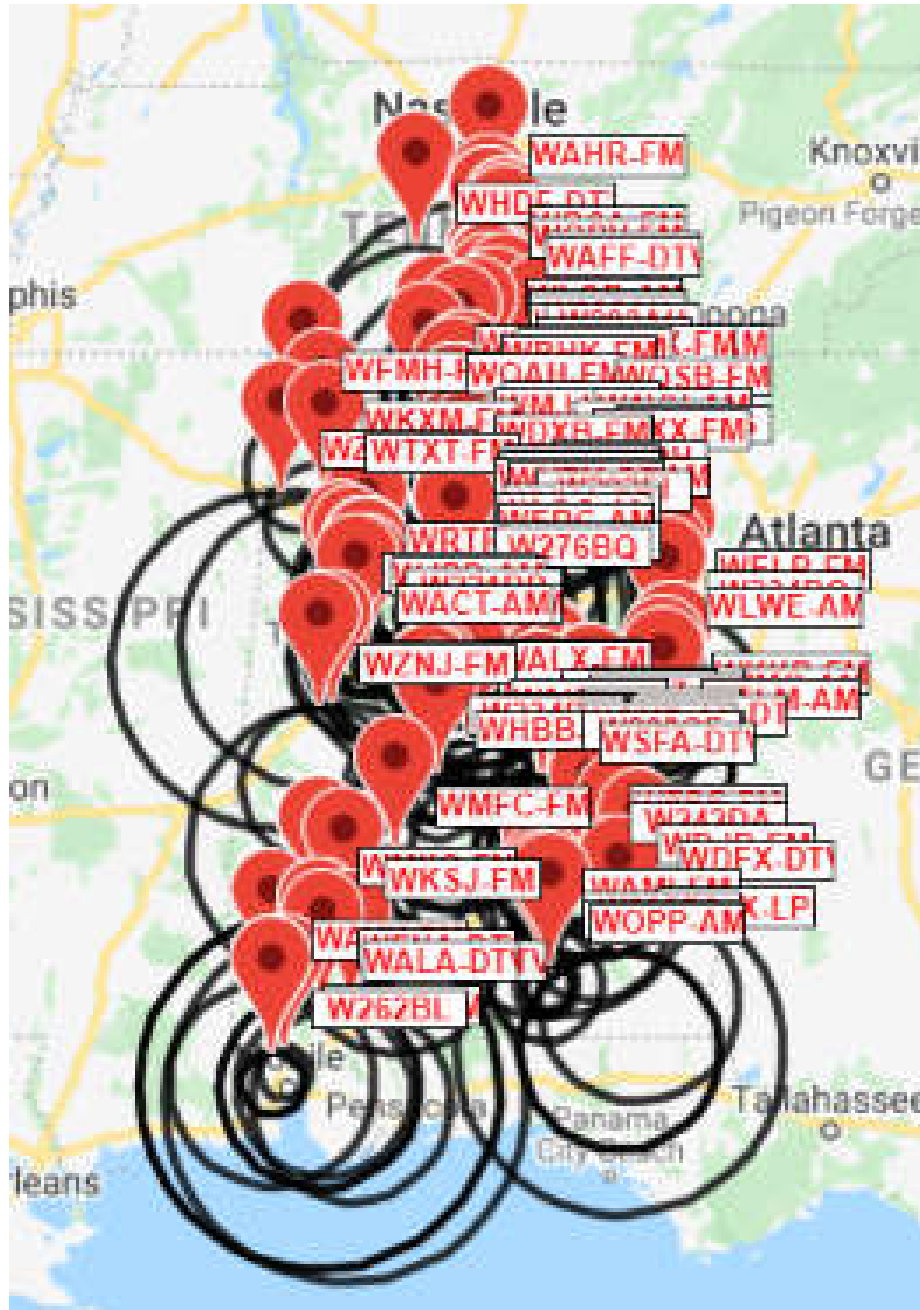

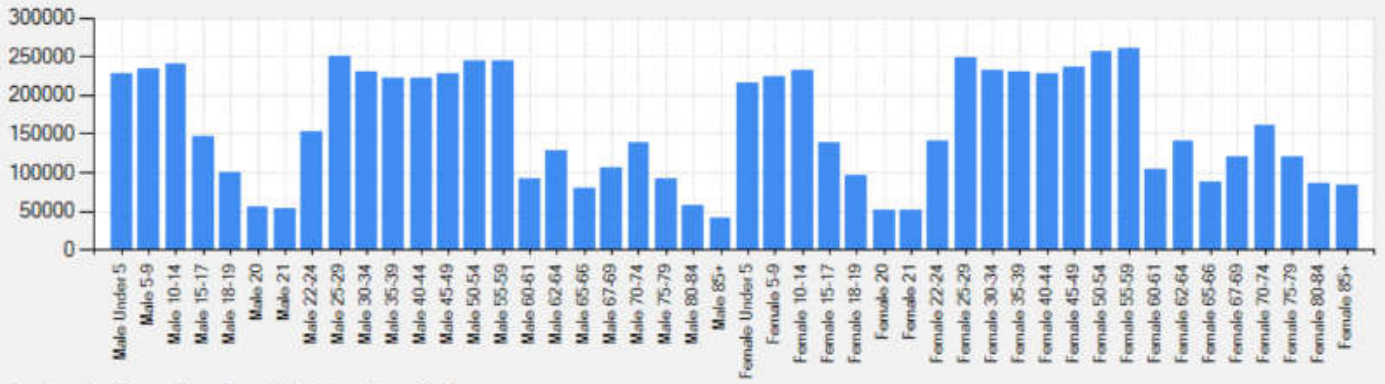

First Quarter Reporting Period 10/01/2020 – 12/31/2020**

The contract for 2019-21 between Alabama PALS and ALDOT was finalized and received by Alabama PALS in July 2019, and includes components which both parties feel will best benefit the growth and maintenance of these valuable statewide programs.

ALDOT and PALS have made final changes to a new and more information specific data base, which will be kept and updated by Alabama PALS. (See Data Base Below) This data base upgrade has afforded PALS a better and more efficient way in which to monitor compliance for the program, keep better contact with the volunteer adoptees, as well as beginning and creating and implementing a new and efficient inspection process for the program.

All new data received from this point forward should reflect accurate information for each adopted mile. The data base is now updated (as of December 31, 2019) with the ability to view exact numbers and locations of State, Federal and County adopted miles. Total miles, groups included in report)

PALS continues to receive a very high level of responses and new applications (see **attachments**) for Adopt A Mile and Adopt a Stream programs during the First Quarter of 2020-21. A new Compliance Reporting Form has been included in the PALS/ Adopt A Mile newsletter, where groups and individuals, PALS Chapters and others can report a group that is not keeping their respective mile of highway cleaned on a regular basis. PALS continues to work with ALDOT to identify miles that are not in the new data base system, did not transfer from the old data base, or were not entered into the old system originally.

2020 Alabama PALS Statewide Governor's Awards Program

The 2019 Statewide Governors Awards program was held at the Renaissance Hotel in Montgomery on November 13, 2019. 40 + awards were presented in categories including, Adopt A Mile, Adopt A Stream, Clean Campus, Spring Cleanup Awards, Volunteer of the Year, Coastal Cleanup, City, County and others. Over 250 statewide volunteers attended the luncheon. PALS presented to awards to volunteers representing 23 Alabama counties.

Due to COVID19 restrictions, The in person 2020 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards was cancelled.

PALS changed the procedure for 2020 Governor's Awards Program due to Covid-19. Changes are made, Alabama PALS will schedule the presentation of all awards on a local basis or by Zoom conference for all winning nominations. Awards will be presented at County Commissions, City Council, schools etc. meetings.

Alabama PALS worked with state sponsors, State Agencies, local governments, as well as coordinators and volunteer groups to provide guidance and distribution of all materials.

Several Mobile county zones were able to continue their respective cleanups on September 26 and 27, however in limited capacity. Other zones will continue to hold their respective cleanup through October.

The 2021 Alabama Coastal Cleanup will be held September 18, 2021. Materials Distribution Day will be held at 5 Rivers Delta Center in Spanish Fort on September 16, 2021.

Fourth Quarter Reporting Period 07/01/2021 – 09/30/2021**

The contract for 2019-21 between Alabama PALS and ALDOT was finalized and received by Alabama PALS in July 2019, and includes components which both parties feel will best benefit the growth and maintenance of these valuable statewide programs.

ALDOT and PALS have made final changes to a new and more information specific data base, which will be kept and updated by Alabama PALS. (See Data Base Below) This data base upgrade has afforded PALS a better and more efficient way in which to monitor compliance for the program, keep better contact with the volunteer adoptees, as well as beginning and creating and implementing a new and efficient inspection process for the program.

All new data received from this point forward should reflect accurate information for each adopted mile. The data base is now updated (as of December 31, 2019) with the ability to view exact numbers and locations of State, Federal and County adopted miles. Total miles, groups included in report)

PALS continues to receive a very high level of responses and new applications (see **attachments**) for Adopt A Mile and Adopt a Stream programs during the Fourth Quarter of 2020-21. A new Compliance Reporting Form has been included in the PALS/ Adopt A Mile newsletter, where groups and individuals, PALS Chapters and others can report a group that is not keeping their respective mile of highway cleaned on a regular basis. PALS continues to work with ALDOT to identify miles that are not in the new data base system, did not transfer from the old data base, or were not entered into the old system originally.

2021 Alabama PALS Statewide Governor's Awards Program

Due to COVID19 restrictions, The in person 2020 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards was cancelled.

PALS changed the procedure for 2020 Governor's Awards Program due to Covid-19. Changes were made, Alabama PALS scheduled the presentation of all awards on a local basis or by Zoom conference for all winning nominations. Awards were presented at County Commissions, City Council, schools etc. meetings.

The 2021 Governors Awards Program is scheduled for November 17, 2021

Governor Kaye Ivey is the anticipated keynote speaker

New Adoptees and Miles Adopted 07/01/21-09/30/21 (see Attached List)

Attached list of AAM applications and signs erected is attached to this report. Reports for all applications, signs mailed and erected are included in each quarterly reports.

Safety Vests are available for all adoptees on State and Federal highways, and notices have been sent to all AAM participants regarding the availability of vests.

Adopt A Mile Signs to be Replaced

Margaret continues to send letters to ALDOT District Engineers regarding the replacement of respective signs for each district, and will continue follow up on future sign replacement as the requests come into the PALS office. As data is updated and added to the new AAM data base, Margaret will continue to correspond with all ALDOT district office in regard to removal or replacement of AAM signs.

ALDOT District Office Correspondence

Margaret remains in touch with ALDOT District offices regarding the new protocol for the Adopt A Mile program. Margaret feels like all Districts are excited about the protocol for the program and feel like having PALS handle all paperwork and signage enables the adoptees to receive the signs in a timely fashion.

Ongoing contact is made with respective District offices regarding applications, paperwork and erecting of AAM signs. District offices of ALDOT have been very willing to assist the PALS office in all aspects.

PALS would like to encourage all ALDOT offices to report to the PALS office, all miles that appear to be picked up on a regular basis, or signs that have faded and become unable to be read. PALS will contact the respective group.

Proposal for Updating Adopt A Mile Procedures

PALS met with Stacey Swindle in late September to discuss the need to have all AAM documents and applications accepted with signatures for E-Sign program. All documents would be emailed to groups and individuals for E-signatures, then emailed to all ALDOT District Engineers for E-signature, therefore eliminating documents having to be mailed, and eliminating paperwork for ALDOT engineers. This would also speed up time for the volunteers to receive their AAM signs in the future.

Also discussed during meeting was the need to go to a web based data base for the Adopt A Mile Program for the future. PALS has discussed this with Todd Jones with ALDOT and can be developed for future use.

Stacey Swindle is working with PALS to move both of these proposals forward.

The 2021 “Don’t Drop It On Alabama” Statewide Cleanup

The 2021 Spring Cleanup ran the entire month of April 2021, with some counties extending their respective cleanups into May and June 2021. PALS will continue to work with the Association of County Commissions to continue cleanups in a 67 counties.

To date, over 655 tons have been reported as picked up during the 2021 cleanup effort. Reports are still being received and PALS will work with each city, county or volunteer group cleanup to give them additional time to participate if needed.

The 2022 “Don’t Drop It On Alabama” Spring Cleanup is scheduled for April 2022.

The NEW 2021 PALS/ALDOT PSA is currently running from June -August 2021. The 3 month contract with the Alabama Broadcasters Association is for the months of June– August 2020.

The 2020 NEW PSA received air time on Radio and Television slots for the 3 month period and received over \$ 244,000 worth of statewide air time for the \$ 25,000 investment.

As in past years, air time and scheduling reports from the Alabama Broadcasters Association will be included in ALDOT reports for that time period.

PALS has uploaded the new ALDOT anti littering PSA on the PALS webpage and Facebook page.

Data Base for Adopt A Mile Program (updated copy on jump drive included in this report)

The Adopt a Mile data base is now current and working effectively. PALS is currently able to view and total exact number of groups and adopted miles by County, State and Federal miles. PALS continues to work with Todd Jones of ALDOT to ensure that the data base is working correctly and enabling PALS to best use the data base for the benefit of the Adopt a Mile program.

PALS continues to provide all data base updates to ALDOT on a quarterly basis.

PALS continues to add/delete and change information to the new Adopt A Mile data base as updated information is collected. In addition to daily attention to the data base, a file system has been created and maintained to assist in creating an accurate account of all County and State and Federal adopted mile in the future.

Adopt a Mile Inspections

The 2020 Adopt A Mile Inspection Program was completed in June 2020. All South Zones adopted miles were inspected and were entered into the Adopt A Mile data base in July 2020. With these entries, all data and inspections are up to date and recorded.

This internship program has proven highly effective and will continue each year as specified in the PALS/ALDOT contract.

All new data from the Intern AAM Inspection Program reports will added to the PALS/AAM data base, reflecting any changes, additions or deletions from current data base.

The AAM inspections focused on the Central Zone for 2021 and began in April 2021. The inspections were completed in May 2021 and all updated data has been entered. The intern also focused on AAM signs that are in bad or unreadable condition, and PALS will be in contact with adoptees and District and County offices to have old signs removed.

We met with and are working with new cities/towns/counties to develop litter prevention awareness programs customized to their areas for effectiveness. KEEP ALABAMA BEAUTIFUL STATEWIDE PROMOTIONS

This time period included a spring/summer litter prevention campaign using multi-platform creative produced during 2020 “Keep It In the Boat”, a video “Don’t Forget Your Trash” and a new radio/audio PSA.

The new radio PSA is part of the upcoming Fall and Winter campaigns which are being produced using across different media. The PSA is sports-related and will be voiced by a variety of sports-related public figures. The script is: “Talking a little trash on the field/during the game — yeah, we get it! Trashing the state with litter — that’s terrible! Keep it clean! Keep Alabama Beautiful!” Many affiliates and partner cities/counties plan to air this during upcoming school and community sporting events with a localized personal message to keep their communities litter free.

During the quarter we targeted travel destinations and waterway recreational areas in Alabama with campaigns by Nextstar Media/WHNT and Al.com. Our collaboration with Alabama Media Group also placed digital placards/ videos “Keep It In the Boat” and the new radio/audio PSA during the preseason spring football promos for Auburn University and The University of Alabama. These combined campaigns resulted in the following metrics for the 3-month period.

The radio versions of “Keep It In the Boat” and “Keep It In the Car” have also been airing as PSAs by more than 15 radio stations across the state several times a week since April and will continue through September. The video versions of those were also sent via eblast to stakeholders in more than 10 counties.

Visits have been planned to 15 counties to work with local programs beginning educational programs in public/private schools, during the upcoming school year, as well as community-wide litter prevention awareness programs. The distribution of vehicle litter bags by businesses, particularly convenience stores, continues to be popular. We also plan to increase the number of State Park locations that also distribute the litter bags to guests.

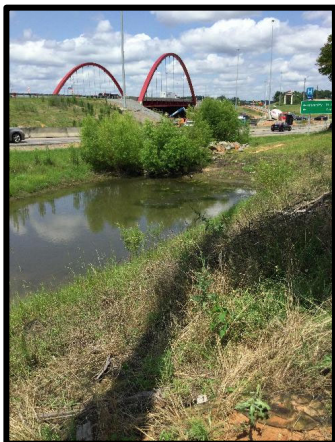
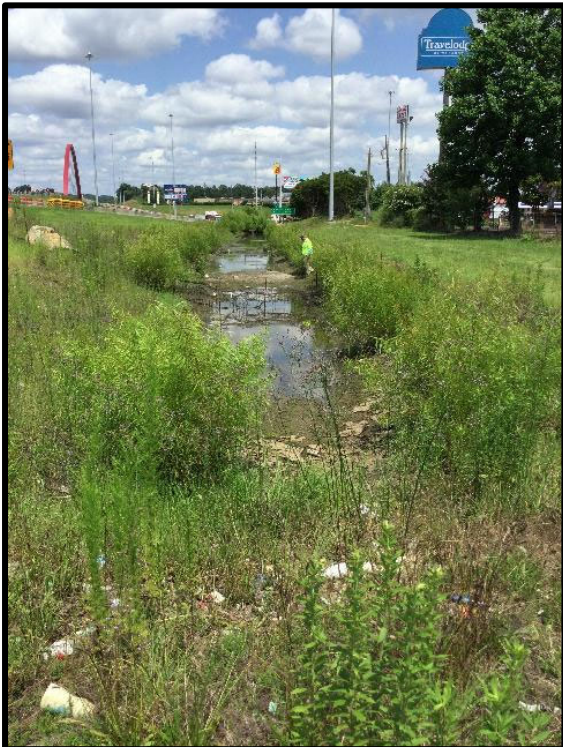

Observation Outcomes Analysis			First-year observation outcomes for all monitoring locations indicate that runoff flow paths on ALDOT property are well-vegetated overall and do not experience noteworthy erosion. Thus, there is no evidence that ALDOT is a significant contributor to the pollution of waters for which sediment or turbidity is a pollutant of concern. ALDOT's general maintenance approach appears to be effective, though increased vigilance with respect to minor erosion instances may be warranted.
