

TITLE VI PROGRAM

I. TITLE VI NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

The Alabama Department of Transportation ensures compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 49 CFR, Part 21, dated October 1, 2012, and related statutes and regulations to the end that no person shall be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Transportation on the grounds of race, color, or national origin; including the denial of meaningful access for Limited English Proficient (LEP) persons. Moreover, The Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) complies with all requirements pertaining to Environmental Justice (EJ) Executive Order 12898 by ensuring that minority populations and low-income populations are not subjected to disproportionately high and adverse environmental impacts and effects.

II. PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW

The purpose of this Title VI Program is to demonstrate how the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau and its subrecipients will comply with the guidance and instructions included in FTA Circular 4702.1B that are necessary to implement the requirements contained in the Title VI regulations issued by the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) (28 CFR Part 42, Subpart F) and the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) (49 CFR Part 21), and to administer programs, policies, and activities in a manner that is consistent with the DOT Order on Environmental Justice (Order 5610.2) and the DOT Policy Guidance Concerning Recipients' Responsibilities to Limited English Proficient (LEP) Persons (70 FR 74087, December 14, 2005).

Extensive Title VI guidance can be found on the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) website at <https://www.transit.dot.gov/title6>. This site contains Title VI training materials, information on filing complaints with FTA, and links to the regulations detailing the Title VI requirements.

This program also provides Alabama Public Transportation Systems with an overview of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as it applies to FTA recipients through the prescription of requirements and procedures which, if followed, will ensure that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance from the Federal Transit Administration.

49 CFR 21.9(b) requires that recipients record and retain certain information and submit it to FTA as necessary or required. ALDOT fulfills this requirement by submitting a Title VI Program to FTA once every three years. Subrecipients of FTA funding submit updated Title VI Programs to ALDOT every three years from the date of their last submission. All Title VI Programs must be approved by the appropriate governing entity or official prior to submission.

The objectives of the ALDOT Title VI Program are to:

- Ensure that the level and quality of transportation services are provided equitably and without regard to race, color, or national origin;
- Avoid, minimize, or mitigate any disproportionately high and adverse human health and environmental effects, including social and economic effects of programs and activities, on minority populations and low-income populations in accordance with EJ Executive Order 12898;
- Ensure the full and fair participation of all affected populations in transportation decision making;
- Prevent the denial, reduction, or delay in benefits related to programs and activities that benefit minority populations or low-income populations; and
- Ensure that persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP) have meaningful access to programs and activities that are administered by recipients and subrecipients.

III. ROLE OF FTA AND ALDOT

1. FTA Role

The FTA Office of Civil Rights conducts periodic discretionary compliance reviews of recipients and subrecipients of FTA funding, including transit providers, state Departments of Transportation, and Metropolitan Planning Organizations to determine their compliance with FTA Circular 4702.1B, "Title VI REQUIREMENTS AND GUIDELINES FOR FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION RECIPIENTS." Compliance reviewers also provide technical assistance and make recommendations regarding corrective actions as deemed necessary and appropriate. Compliance reviews assess the recipient or subrecipient's efforts to meet the requirements under the "General Reporting" and "Program-Specific Reporting" sections of the Title VI Circular and any additional information that is necessary to determine if the grantee is in compliance with Title VI.

These reviews are conducted separately from the triennial, state management, or planning certification reviews. They are conducted either as a desk audit or during an on-site visit. A review may cover all or a portion of the recipient's or subrecipient's compliance with the Title VI requirements. Reviews are conducted at the discretion of FTA, and their scope is defined on a case-by-case basis. The selection of recipients or subrecipients for compliance reviews is primarily based on the following factors:

- Lawsuits, complaints, or investigations conducted by organizations other than FTA alleging that the recipient or subrecipient is deficient or non-compliant with Title VI;
- Problems brought to the attention of FTA by other Federal, State, or local civil rights agencies;
- Incomplete Title VI Programs that were previously submitted to FTA by a recipient;
- Title VI findings or recommendations on prior triennial, state management, or planning certification reviews that have not been sufficiently resolved or implemented, or repeat findings in any FTA review concerning Title VI; and
- The length of time since the last compliance review.

After reviewing the recipient or subrecipient's efforts to meet the general requirements and guidelines of the circular, FTA will issue findings in a draft report stating one of the following: no deficiencies, findings of deficiencies, or advisory comments. The recipient or subrecipient will have the opportunity to review and respond to the draft report. After FTA has received and reviewed the agency's response, it will publish a final report that will be provided to the recipient or subrecipient and will also be subject to requests from the public under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). If findings of deficiencies remain in the final report, the recipient or subrecipient will be required to take corrective action and report on its progress to FTA on a basis deemed appropriate. Once FTA determines that the recipient or subrecipient has satisfactorily responded to the review's findings, it will inform the agency that the review process has ended and release it from further progress reporting in response to the review. Compliance reviews may be followed up with additional reviews as necessary.

In a situation where the recipient or subrecipient fails to take appropriate corrective action in response to the findings of deficiency in the report, FTA may initiate enforcement proceedings that could result in suspension, termination, refusal to grant or provide continued Federal financial assistance to a recipient or subrecipient, or a referral to the Department of Justice with a recommendation that appropriate proceedings be brought to enforce Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

2. ALDOT Role

ALDOT is required to comply with all Title VI requirements. ALDOT must also ensure that its subrecipients are in compliance with Title VI requirements and demonstrate that subrecipients were selected for funding in a nondiscriminatory manner. ALDOT maintains and provides data and other relevant information as required by FTA, including all pertinent data obtained from subrecipients. On-site Title VI compliance reviews will be periodically conducted with subrecipients as determined necessary by the ALDOT Title VI Office. Reviewers will:

- Inspect all materials pertaining to the implementation of Title VI and verify that all services are being implemented consistent with the most current Title VI Program;
- Review all Title VI complaints and their outcomes and provide subrecipient with comments and any needed follow-up action;
- Inquire about any problems involving service delivery to the minority, low-income, and LEP communities and possible solutions; and
- Review other information necessary for compliance with the Title VI Program requirements consistent with FTA Circular 4702.1B, dated October 1, 2012.

Upon conclusion of the review, ALDOT will issue a compliance report. This report will contain the subrecipient's state of compliance, including recommendations and corrective actions regarding the Title VI Program. If a subrecipient fails to submit any requested information, their pending grant or grant application may be delayed.

In addition to the periodic compliance reviews, ALDOT will:

- Provide direction and technical assistance to ALDOT's subrecipients, cities, counties, Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs), and contractors to ensure compliance with Title VI;
- Ensure that Title VI requirements are included in program area directives to prevent perceived or real discrimination;
- Attend ALDOT public hearings and monitor for adequate participation of communities affected by ALDOT activities;
- Investigate and resolve filed Title VI complaints;
- Develop and update ALDOT's Title VI Program to reflect organizational policy or implementation changes;
- Submit annual accomplishment report and work plan of Title VI activities to FTA; and
- Develop and periodically deliver Title VI and Environmental Justice Training.

IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS

All applicants for FTA financial assistance, including those entities that are applying for FTA assistance for the first time, must complete the following procedures to comply with the Title VI regulations. ALDOT complies with all requirements for the submission and implementation of Title VI Programs as described in the FTA Circular, 4702.1B, dated October 1, 2012.

- Every application for financial assistance from FTA must be accompanied by an assurance that the applicant will administer the program in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. This requirement is considered fulfilled when the applicant submits its Annual Certifications and Assurances to ALDOT.
- For first time applicants, in addition to the certifications and assurances described above, entities applying for FTA funding shall provide information regarding their Title VI compliance history if they have previously received Federal funding from another Federal agency. This documentation shall include a summary of any Title VI compliance review activities conducted in the last three years. The summary should include:
 - The purpose or reason for the review;
 - The name of the agency or organization that performed the review;
 - A summary of the findings and recommendations of the review; and
 - A report on the status and/or disposition of such findings and recommendations. This information should be relevant to the organizational entity submitting the application, not necessarily the larger agency or department which oversees the entity.

ALDOT requires that all applicants submit the following information with their respective grant applications:

- List of all active lawsuits or complaints against the transit provider alleging discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin with respect to service or other transit benefits.
- Description of all pending applications for financial assistance currently provided by other Federal agencies to the applicant.
- Summary of all civil rights compliance reviews conducted by other local, state or Federal agencies during the last three years.
- The date of the most recent signing of the Annual Certification and Assurances.

ALDOT submits its annual Title VI assurances as part of its annual Certification and Assurance Submission to FTA through TrAM.

V. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND GUIDELINES

1. Introduction

ALDOT complied with the FTA Circular 4702.1B dated October 1, 2012 in the preparation of this Title VI Program.

2. Requirement to Provide Title VI Assurances

In accordance with 49 CFR Section 21.7, every application for financial assistance from FTA must be accompanied by an assurance that the applicant will administer the program in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. ALDOT

fulfills this requirement by submitting the annual certification and assurances to FTA, and subrecipients submit Title VI assurances to ALDOT prior to receiving FTA funds. ALDOT submits its annual Certification and Assurance via TrAM.

3. Requirement for First Time Applicants

ALDOT is not a first-time applicant.

4. Requirement to Prepare and Submit a Title VI Program

ALDOT complies with all requirements of Title 49 CFR, Section 21.9 (b), for record keeping and subrecipient submission requirements.

5. Requirement to Notify Beneficiaries of Protection under Title VI

ALDOT and subrecipients of FTA funding provide information to the public regarding their Title VI obligations and protections against race, color, and national origin discrimination. This information is disseminated by posting the Notice to the Public on the agency's website and in public areas of the agency's office(s), including the reception desk and meeting rooms. This notice is also posted in all transit vehicles and at transit stations and stops. If subrecipients do not have a website, their Title VI Notice to the Public is posted on the ALTRANS website.

ALDOT's Title VI Nondiscrimination Statement can be found in Section I of this document. This statement is included in the Notice to the Public along with a description of procedures for the public to request additional information or file a Title VI discrimination complaint. ALDOT's Title VI Program is available at <http://www.dot.state.al.us/programs>TitleVI.html> and is disseminated by ALDOT in other formats. The "call for projects" for FTA funded transportation programs includes a statement that prohibits discrimination due to race, color, or national origin.

When needed, this Title VI Program will be translated into languages other than English in accordance with the USDOT LEP Guidance and ALDOT's language assistance plan.

Subrecipients may adopt ALDOT's Title VI Notice to the Public provided that they add information for filing discrimination complaints directly with their agency. ALDOT will provide assistance to subrecipients upon request or as ALDOT deems necessary. A copy of the Title VI Notice to the Public can be found in Appendix A.

6. Requirement to Develop Title VI Complaint Procedures and Complaint Form

A Title VI complaint may be filed by any individual who believes he or she has experienced discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin. ALDOT's Title VI Complaint Form can be found in Appendix B of this document. This form must be complete, signed, and filed within 180 days of the date of the alleged act of discrimination. The Complaint Form should be submitted to:

Each complaint must include the following information:

- Name, address, and telephone number of complainant;
- Name and address of the agency, program, organization, and/or employee's name that complainant believes discriminated against him/her;
- Description of how, why, and when (include date(s)) complainant believes he/she was subject to discrimination including as much background information as possible about the alleged act(s) of discrimination; and
- Signature of complainant or his/her representative.

In a situation where the complainant is unable or incapable of providing a written complaint, a verbal discrimination complaint may be made to the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau. The complainant will be interviewed, and the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau will assist the complainant in converting the verbal allegations to a formal, written complaint.

When a completed Complaint Form is received, the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau will forward it to the ALDOT Bureau of Compliance and Business Opportunities – Title VI Program who will determine if ALDOT has jurisdiction to investigate the complaint. Complaints filed with ALDOT against contractors, consultants, or other subrecipients will be investigated by ALDOT. Any complaints determined to be outside ALDOT's jurisdiction will be referred to the appropriate state or Federal agency. The ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau will send a written acknowledgement letter by registered mail to notify the complainant that their complaint was received and to inform them if it will be investigated by ALDOT or if it will be referred to another jurisdiction.

For complaints that are determined to merit further investigation, ALDOT will assign an investigator. A complete investigation will be conducted, and an investigative report will be submitted to the Local Transportation Bureau. ALDOT will strive to complete a Title VI complaint investigation within 180 days of the date that the complaint is received. ALDOT will also strive to obtain early resolution of complaints at the lowest level possible. The option of informal mediation between the complainant and ALDOT may be utilized to resolve complaints.

A complaint may be recommended for dismissal for any of the following reasons:

- The complainant requests withdrawal of the complaint;

- The complainant fails to respond to repeated requests for additional information needed to process the complaint; and/or
- The complainant cannot be located after reasonable attempts are made to contact him/her.

In cases where a subrecipient is being investigated, ALDOT will provide the subrecipient with the opportunity to respond to the allegations in writing. ALDOT's investigative team will be responsible for evaluating the complaint, conducting interviews, collecting and analyzing evidence, and preparing an investigative report.

The Local Transportation Bureau will notify the complainant of the outcome of the investigation and will send a copy of the investigative report to FTA or other appropriate Federal agency. In situations where an investigation is delayed, the investigator will notify the appropriate authorities to request an extension.

ALDOT maintains an internal manual and computerized tracking system for all filed Title VI complaints. As of the submission of this updated Title VI Program, ALDOT has not received any Title VI complaints against ALDOT or its subrecipients.

ALDOT has developed these procedures to address Title VI complaints. These procedures do not deny the complainant's right to file formal complaints with other state or Federal agencies or to seek private counsel for complaints alleging discrimination.

In accordance with FTA Circular 4702.1B and to reduce the administrative burden of the requirements associated with these Title VI complaint procedures, FTA will allow subrecipients to adopt the Title VI complaint investigation and tracking procedures developed by ALDOT.

7. Requirement to Record and Report Transit-Related Title VI Investigations, Complaints, and Lawsuits

All recipients and subrecipients must prepare and maintain a list of any of the following that allege discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin: active investigations conducted by entities other than FTA, complaints naming the recipient or subrecipient, and/or lawsuits. This list shall include the date that the investigation, complaint, or lawsuit was filed; a summary of the allegation(s); the status of the investigation, complaint, or lawsuit; and final findings or actions taken by the recipient in response to the investigation, complaint, or lawsuit.

ALDOT and its subrecipients include this list in their Title VI Programs that are submitted every three years. ALDOT has had no investigations, complaints, or lawsuits that allege discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin since the last submission of the Title VI Program. A copy of the List of Transit-Related Investigations, Complaints, and Lawsuits form that will be used to record any Title VI investigations, complaints, or lawsuits can be found in Appendix C.

8. Promoting Inclusive Public Participation

ALDOT understands that inclusive public participation is essential to having a successful and active transit program. Effective public involvement provides transportation officials with new and innovative ideas while also alerting them to potential environmental justice concerns. Public participation provides a sense of individual and collective ownership among the public, particularly in minority, low-income, and LEP communities who are often at the mercy of their surroundings. ALDOT is committed to a public participation process that offers early and continuous participation opportunities in the transportation decision making process to its subrecipients and all segments of the population within its comprehensive constituency. This inclusive public involvement process meets and exceeds all requirements of FTA Circular, 4702.1B and meets the letter and spirit of the Title VI requirements.

To more fully integrate the opinions of minority, low-income, and LEP populations into community outreach activities, ALDOT's public participation program will:

- Continue to coordinate with the Alabama Association of Regional Councils and other community-based organizations to identify and implement strategies to reach out to members in the affected minority, low-income, and LEP communities.
- Reduce barriers to public participation from this segment of the population.
- Utilize the media (newspaper, radio, television, internet, etc.) to target the minority, low-income, and LEP populations in public involvement efforts.
- Provide opportunities for public participation through means other than written communication, such as personal interviews or the use of audio or video recording devices to capture oral comments, suggestions, and recommendations.
- Hold public meetings in locations, facilities, and at meeting times that are convenient and accessible to the minority, low-income, and LEP populations.
- Hold virtual meetings that are convenient and accessible to the minority, low-income, and LEP populations. Partner with libraries to provide computers, internet access, and assistance. Provide a call-in option for those unable to attend via computer.
- Ensure that the decision-making process adequately considers the issues and concerns raised by the minority, low-income, and LEP populations.

- Evaluate the effectiveness of the public participation process.
- Host meetings in varying sizes and formats.
- Coordinate with community and faith-based organizations, educational institutions, and other organizations to implement public engagement strategies that reach out specifically to members of the affected minority and/or LEP communities.
- Share public involvement opportunities on websites and social media sites with an option to translate the information to other languages.

ALDOT will continue to reach out and provide improved opportunities for the minority, low-income, and LEP populations to participate in transit project planning and the decision-making process.

ALDOT's Public Participation Involvement and Outreach for 2020-2022:

- Gave adequate public notice of public participation activities.
- Provided opportunities for the public to review and comment at key decision points.
- Offered multiple accessible participation formats including electronic and in-person.

9. Requirement to Provide Meaningful Access to Limited English Proficient (LEP) Persons

Language barriers often prohibit LEP people from obtaining services and information related to transportation programs. FTA requires recipients and subrecipients to take reasonable steps to ensure that LEP individuals have meaningful access to the benefits, services, information, and other portions of their programs and activities. To meet this requirement, ALDOT posts vital documents for FTA funded transportation programs including the Title VI Notice to the Public, Complaint Procedures, and the Complaint Form on the Alabama Department of Transportation website at <https://www.dot.state.al.us/programs/TitleVI.html> in both English and Spanish. In addition, ALDOT is willing to provide documents in other languages as needed. ALDOT fulfills this need by utilizing bilingual staff and maintaining a list of qualified interpreters and businesses that can provide translation services on an as-needed basis.

ALDOT and its subrecipients are required to identify and implement reasonable actions to ensure meaningful access to their programs and activities by LEP persons. The Four Factor Analysis is used to determine the appropriate language services to be offered by each recipient or subrecipient. The following factors are evaluated to determine the type of language assistance that is needed:

(1) Number or proportion of LEP persons eligible to be served or likely to be encountered by the program, activity, or service

(a) How LEP persons interact with the recipient's agency

- (b) Identification of LEP communities and assessing the number or proportion of LEP persons from each language group to determine the appropriate language services for each language group
- (c) The literacy skills of LEP populations in their native languages, in order to determine whether translation of documents will be an effective practice
- (d) Whether LEP persons are underserved by the recipient due to language barriers

(2) The frequency with which LEP persons come into contact with the program, activity, or service

- (a) Use of bus and rail service
- (b) Purchase of passes and tickets through vending machines, outlets, websites, and over the phone
- (c) Participation in public meetings
- (d) Customer services interactions
- (e) Ridership surveys
- (f) Operator surveys

(3) The nature and importance of the program, activity, or service provided by the program to people's lives

(4) The resources available to the recipient for LEP outreach, as well as the costs associated with that outreach

ALDOT has developed a statewide Limited English Proficiency Plan (LEP) and continues to provide guidance to subrecipients as they develop their individual LEP Plans. All plans are based on current census data, local and statewide demographics, and population(s) served. Language assistance is provided through a series of methods including but not limited to interpretation, translation, and distribution of translated materials pertaining to transportation services in the areas where LEP populations reside and utilize public transit. LEP populations are notified about the availability of language assistance through dissemination of translated printed materials, distribution of hand-outs to advocacy groups and LEP populations that are utilizing transportation services, and notifications in local newspapers that target LEP populations. ALDOT continues to seek other means to heighten the awareness level within LEP populations regarding available language assistance. All ALDOT subrecipients are required to periodically evaluate and update their language assistance plans based on several factors, including but not limited to, census and demographic data updates, feedback from LEP populations, and changes in transit system utilization by the LEP population. ALDOT has personnel who are properly equipped to train local subrecipient personnel to provide timely and reasonable language assistance to LEP populations, particularly those LEP groups that have been identified to need language assistance.

ALDOT LEP PLAN

Four Factor Analysis Results:

(1) Number or proportion of LEP persons eligible to be served or likely to be encountered by the program, activity, or service

- (a) How LEP persons interact with the recipient's agency

ALDOT does not provide or maintain any fixed route or demand response transit service. Consequently, LEP persons interact with ALDOT on a very limited basis. It is possible that LEP persons could be encountered during meetings held by ALDOT or its subrecipients. It is more likely that LEP persons will interact with the subrecipients who provide regular programs, activities, and services.

- (b) Identification of LEP communities and assessing the number or proportion of LEP persons from each language group to determine the appropriate language services for each language group

LEP communities are determined by analyzing current U.S. Census data and by preparing/obtaining local community and regional demographic maps. According to the U.S. Census Bureau 2020 American Community Survey Table S1601, approximately 5.3% of residents in the State of Alabama speak a language other than English at home, and 2.1% of Alabama residents report speaking English less than very well in ALDOT's area of jurisdiction. Most LEP individuals speak Spanish, followed by Asian and Pacific Island languages and other Indo-European languages. In addition, a small percentage of LEP persons speak other languages. ALDOT also considers the literacy skills of LEP populations in their native languages, in order to determine whether translation of documents will be an effective practice.

- (c) Whether LEP persons are underserved by the recipient due to language barriers

ALDOT researches current statewide U.S. Census data to determine if there are areas where LEP persons are underserved by transit. Furthermore, ALDOT requires that subrecipients who provide transit service submit local demographic data, service maps, and ridership data showing that there are no local underserved LEP persons due to language barriers.

(2) The frequency with which LEP persons come into contact with the program, activity, or service

- (a) Use of bus and rail services

ALDOT does not provide any bus or rail service. Fixed route and/or demand response bus services are provided by ALDOT's subrecipients. ALDOT requires each subrecipient to submit monthly, quarterly, semi-annual, and annual reports documenting, verifying, and validating how often LEP persons utilize their services. Currently, ALDOT does not contract with any subrecipients to provide rail services.

- (b) Purchase of passes and tickets through vending machines, outlets, websites, and over the phone

ALDOT requires subrecipients to maintain and submit data pertaining to ticket purchases to assess how often LEP persons are purchasing tickets for transit services.

- (c) Participation in public meetings

ALDOT evaluates public meeting attendance to determine how often LEP persons are attending. Subrecipients are also required to evaluate their meetings for participation by LEP individuals.

- (d) Customer services interactions

ALDOT requires all subrecipients to assess their customer service interactions to determine how often LEP persons inquire about local transit services. Results are shared with ALDOT for evaluation.

- (e) Ridership surveys

ALDOT requires all subrecipients to conduct ridership surveys and to provide ALDOT with results and conclusions to determine how often LEP persons are riding the buses. ALDOT reviews and analyzes the survey results.

- (f) Operator surveys

ALDOT requires all subrecipients to conduct operator surveys to determine how often operators encounter LEP persons. Survey results are submitted to ALDOT for review and analysis.

(3) The nature and importance of the program, activity, or service provided by the program to people's lives

ALDOT and its subrecipients have determined that each transit program in Alabama is significantly important to all users including LEP persons. As the programs grow, it is more likely that language services will be desired and needed. Public transportation is especially vital for people without access to personal vehicles as mobility enhances and improves the user's quality

of life. ALDOT and all contracted subrecipients will assess their programs, activities, and services to ensure they are providing meaningful access to LEP persons.

(4) The resources available to the recipient for LEP outreach, as well as the costs associated with that outreach

ALDOT and its subrecipients have allocated appropriate resources for local, regional, and statewide LEP outreach. ALDOT maximizes resource utilization for the LEP community by sharing language assistance materials and services among and between advocacy groups and LEP populations as needed.

Subrecipients provide language services through oral interpretation, either in person or via telephone interaction, and/or through written translation. The level of required resources and the associated cost may impact the effort to provide meaningful access for LEP persons. Smaller subrecipients with more limited budgets are not expected to provide the same level of language services that can be provided by larger entities with more available funds. It is recommended that subrecipients evaluate the most cost-effective means to meet this requirement before limiting services due to resource concerns. At a minimum, ALDOT recommends that summaries of important documents be translated upon request and qualified community volunteers be utilized when oral translation is needed.

The results of the Four Factor Analysis revealed that language assistance is needed in Alabama. According to the 2020 U.S. Census data, most LEP individuals speak Spanish, followed by Asian and Pacific Island languages and other Indo-European languages. The number and proportion of LEP persons eligible to be served or likely to be encountered by the program or recipient; the frequency with which LEP persons come in contact with the program; the nature and importance of the program, activity, or service provided by the program to people's lives; and the resources available to the recipient for LEP outreach, as well as the costs associated with the outreach, will always be considered when adjusting and modifying the LEP Plan to ensure that the transportation needs of LEP populations are being met in a manner consistent with the Title VI requirements.

ALDOT provides language assistance services by language based on demographic data within the transit service area, specific feedback from LEP groups, subrecipient bus operator and rider surveys, and feedback from subrecipients who provide transportation services to the LEP populations. ALDOT uses language flash cards and web-based translation services, posts information on the website in multiple languages, partners with organizations who provide interpretation/translation services, and provides staff members who can offer translation services as needed.

ALDOT notifies LEP groups about the availability of language assistance services through focus group and community town-hall meetings, notifications advertised in media within LEP communities, television, radio, ALDOT's website, and newspapers specific to LEP populations.

ALDOT provides language assistance training to its transit employees and subrecipients at their new hire or transit manager orientation. Additional training is provided during ALDOT's annual Transit Management Workshops. Training includes implementing the LEP requirements, accommodating LEP individuals, and providing translators and translation resources.

As the Transportation Designated and Primary Recipient, ALDOT monitors, evaluates, and updates the language access plan by assessing feedback provided by the subrecipients. ALDOT also makes announced and unannounced visits to subrecipients and monitors their activities to ensure that the contracted transportation services are being provided and that the needs of the LEP populations are being met consistent with the U.S. DOT requirements.

SAFE HARBOR PROVISION

DOT/ DOJ's Safe Harbor Provision outlines circumstances that can provide a "safe harbor" for recipients regarding the translation of written material for LEP populations. The provision states that recipients shall provide written translation of vital documents for each eligible LEP language group that constitutes five percent (5%) or 1,000 persons, whichever is less, of the total population of persons eligible to be served or likely to be affected or encountered. According to the 2020 U.S. Census data, the following language groups exceed 1,000 persons in the State of Alabama: Spanish, other Indo-European languages, Asian and Pacific Island languages, and other languages. ALDOT focuses translation efforts in Spanish which is the largest language group other than English. Vital documents including the Notice to the Public, the Complaint Procedures, and the Complaint Form are available in Spanish. ALDOT also provides free translation services upon request.

ALDOT requires that subrecipients provide written translation of vital documents for each eligible LEP language group in their service area that exceeds the threshold. ALDOT periodically evaluates and assesses whether translating vital documents is the most effective and efficient method to provide language assistance to the LEP populations.

10. MINORITY REPRESENTATION ON PLANNING AND ADVISORY BODIES

ALDOT is knowledgeable of all requirements found in Title 49 CFR Section 21.5(b) and shall not "deny a person the opportunity to participate as a member of a planning, advisory, or similar body which is an integral part of the program" on the grounds of race, color, or national origin. ALDOT has not established any transit-related, non-elected planning boards, advisory councils, or committees. In lieu of

a board adoption, ALDOT's Title VI Program is reviewed and approved by the State of Alabama Transportation Director before it is submitted to the FTA.

If ALDOT establishes future planning and advisory bodies, a table will be used to depict the racial breakdown of the membership and will be included in future Title VI programs. Additionally, a description of efforts made to encourage the participation of minorities on such committees will be included.

11. PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO SUBRECIPIENTS

Title 49 CFR Section 21.9(b) states that if "a primary recipient extends Federal financial assistance to any other recipient, such other recipient shall also submit such compliance reports to the primary recipient as may be necessary to enable the primary recipient to carry out its obligations". ALDOT assists subrecipients with their reporting requirements by disseminating the following information to them:

- a. Sample notices to the public informing beneficiaries of their rights under DOT's Title VI regulations, procedures on how to file a Title VI complaint, and ALDOT's Title VI complaint form.
- b. Sample procedures for tracking and investigating Title VI complaints filed with a subrecipient and when ALDOT expects to be notified of complaints received by the subrecipient.
- c. Demographic information on the race and English proficiency of residents served by the subrecipient. This information will assist the subrecipient in assessing the level and quality of services it provides to communities within its service area and in assessing the need for language assistance.

Potential subrecipients seeking funding are also given the above information. New applicants serving predominantly minority populations receive additional technical assistance regarding Title VI requirements and language assistance.

12. MONITORING SUBRECIPIENTS

ALDOT monitors subrecipients in accordance with 49 CFR 21.9(b) to ensure that they are complying with the DOT Title VI requirements. As the Primary Recipient, ALDOT fully understands that if a subrecipient is found to be non-compliant, then ALDOT is also considered to be non-compliant. To ensure that the subrecipients are compliant, ALDOT uses the Compliance Review Document in Appendix D and continues to:

- a. Document its process for ensuring that all subrecipients are complying with the general requirements and guidelines as defined in Chapter III of the FTA Circular, 4702.1B, dated October 1, 2012, as well as other requirements that apply to the subrecipients based on the type of entity and the number of fixed route vehicles it operates in peak service.
- b. Collect Title VI Programs from subrecipients, review the programs for compliance, and store the programs for future access.

- c. Request that subrecipients verify that their level and quality of service is provided on an equitable basis. This verification is done upon request from the FTA, in response to any discrimination complaints, or as deemed necessary by ALDOT.

13. DETERMINATION OF SITE OR LOCATION OF FACILITIES

ALDOT did not select a site or location for facilities during the period from 2020 through 2022, and there are no current plans to construct FTA funded facilities. If future plans include constructing FTA funded facilities, ALDOT shall comply with all requirements in Title 49 CFR section 21.9(b)(3) and will not select the site or location of facilities with the purpose or effect of excluding persons from, denying them the benefits of, or subjecting them to discrimination under any program on the grounds of race, color, or national origin or with the purpose or effect of defeating or substantially impairing the objectives of Title VI, 4702.1B, dated October 1, 2012. ALDOT understands that for this requirement, “facilities” does not include bus shelters which are transit amenities, nor does it include transit stations, power substations, etc., as those are evaluated during project development and the NEPA process.

ALDOT will complete a Title VI equity analysis during the planning stage of any new facility related to the potential site location to ensure the location is selected without regard to race, color, or national origin. Wherever necessary and/or required, ALDOT will engage in outreach to persons potentially impacted by the placement of facilities. A Title VI equity analysis will be completed before the site selection to compare the equity impacts of various alternatives. A copy of the Title VI Construction Project Analysis form that will be used to perform the equity analysis can be found in Appendix E.

14. REQUIREMENT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION UPON REQUEST

ALDOT shall comply with all requests from the FTA for additional information to investigate complaints of discriminations or to resolve concerns about possible noncompliance with the DOT's Title VI regulations.

VI. REQUIREMENT FOR STATES

ALDOT receives Federal financial assistance from the FTA and continues to implement the general requirements and guidelines outlined in Chapter III of FTA Circular 4702.1B. ALDOT does not provide fixed route public transportation.

1. Requirement To Prepare and Submit a Title VI Program

ALDOT complies with Title 49 CFR Section 21.9(b) by submitting reports to the FTA to demonstrate compliance with the DOT Title VI regulation. In Appendices F and G of this Title VI Program, ALDOT has provided “racial and ethnic data showing the extent to which members of minority groups are beneficiaries of programs receiving Federal financial assistance”. ALDOT submits an updated

Title VI Program to the FTA Regional Civil Rights Officer every three years. As a State Department of Transportation (DOT), ALDOT's governing entity is the state's Transportation Director who has reviewed and approved this Title VI Program. As a Direct and Primary Recipient, ALDOT complies with all requirements stated in FTA Circular 4702.1B to monitor and report subrecipient activity and ensure that they submit individual Title VI Programs.

The following state specific information is included in ALDOT's Title VI Program:

- a. ALDOT has included details showing how the department complies with the general requirements of Chapter III of the Title VI Circular dated October 1, 2012.
- b. Since ALDOT does not provide fixed route public transportation services, Chapter IV is not applicable. However, ALDOT requires fixed route subrecipients to comply with these requirements.
- c. ALDOT has prepared maps depicting the demographic profile of the State of Alabama. These maps show distribution by age, salary, education, and the ability to speak English. The maps can be found in Appendix F.
- d. ALDOT has developed demographic maps that show the percent of minority populations as identified in the current American Community Survey data at the census tract level. Additional maps show total poverty and total transit usage by language group. These maps are located in Appendix F. ALDOT also prepared a map showing how public transportation funds are distributed throughout the State. This map is included in Appendix G.
- e. ALDOT analyzed the maps in Appendices F and G for disparate impacts on the basis of race, color, or national origin. No significant impacts were found, so at this time there is no justification to develop a remediation policy. If significant real or perceived impacts are found in the future, ALDOT will swiftly develop and implement alternatives to reduce the discriminatory impact.
- f. ALDOT's Environmental Section maintains the demographic information that is used in the Title VI Program to certify compliance. Analyzing this data allows for considerations expressed in the USDOT Order on Environmental Justice to be integrated into statewide planning activities. The current ALDOT Statewide Transportation Plan incorporates environmental justice planning throughout the project development process. The statewide transportation planning process identifies transportation needs within minority populations through a public involvement process that includes outreach meetings and sessions that are accessible to minority and LEP populations.
- g. ALDOT provides pass through FTA financial assistance to its subrecipients without regard to race, color, or national origin. This procedure is based on funding availability, requests from subrecipients, and an individual evaluation and assessment of need based on ridership and population served. ALDOT also selects a cross population representative of the

community to receive funding to ensure equity and eliminate any real or perceived discrimination in the selection process.

- h. ALDOT conducts individual and collective workshops, seminars, and training sessions to prepare its subrecipients to apply for funding. These training opportunities are designed to ensure that all interested applicants are provided funding information in a non-discriminatory manner, and subrecipients who serve predominately minority populations are encouraged to participate. Similar assistance is also provided to whomever requests it.

2. Planning

ALDOT conducts planning activities consistent with 49 U.S.C Section 5304, Statewide Transportation Planning, as well as Subpart B of 23 CFR Part 450, Statewide Transportation Planning and Programming. ALDOT has developed a schedule to collect Title VI Programs from MPOs who are subrecipients of Federal transit funding. All Title VI Programs are collected electronically. ALDOT monitors these MPOs to ensure compliance with their Title VI Programs.

ALDOT self-certifies compliance with all applicable Federal requirements that will be reviewed by the FTA and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in the joint Statewide Planning Review. As part of the planning certification review, FTA/FHWA will determine whether ALDOT has:

- a. Analyzed regional demographic data to identify minority populations within the non-urbanized areas of the state.
- b. Where necessary, provided local service providers and agencies with data to assist them in identifying minority populations in their respective areas.
- c. Ensured that members of minority communities are provided with full opportunities to engage in the Statewide Transportation Planning Process including implementing actions to eliminate language, mobility, temporal, and other obstacles to allow these populations to participate fully in the process.
- d. Monitored the activities of subrecipients with regard to Title VI compliance where ALDOT passes funds through to subrecipients.

3. Requirements for Program Administration

In accordance with 49 CFR Section 21.5, the general nondiscrimination provision, ALDOT shall document that FTA funds are passed to subrecipients through programs including but not limited to Section 5310 (Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities) and Section 5311 (Formula Grants for Rural Areas). Subrecipients are awarded funding without regard to race, color, or national origin, and ALDOT assures that minority populations are not denied the benefits of or excluded from participation in the programs.

ALDOT collects and maintains the following information for FTA but does not

submit it unless it is requested by FTA:

- a. A record of funding requests received from private non-profit organizations, state or local governmental authorities, and Indian tribes. The record identifies if applicants plan to use grant program funds to assist predominantly minority populations. It also indicates which applications were rejected and accepted for funding.

A record of funding requests received by ALDOT is included in Appendix H.

- b. A description of how ALDOT develops its annual program of projects that is submitted to FTA as part of its grant applications. This description explains the method used to ensure the equitable distribution of funds to subrecipients that serve predominantly minority populations, including Native Americans tribes, where present. Equitable distribution can be achieved by engaging in outreach to diverse stakeholders regarding the availability of funds and ensuring that the competitive process is not itself a barrier to selection of minority applicants.

ALDOT makes an annual announcement for all programs, usually during the first quarter of the Federal Fiscal Year which goes from October 1st through September 30th. At that time, grant applications are solicited from eligible subrecipients and annual or multi-year agreements are distributed as necessary to the Subrecipients. The program period of performance is based on the Federal Fiscal Year. The announcements provide information on anticipated Federal funds and solicit applications from eligible subrecipients. The final awards are contingent on FTA's apportionment of funds to ALDOT, as published in the Federal Register. At a minimum, ALDOT publicly advertises the availability of funds to potential applicants by letter, email, through the ALDOT (Transit Section page) and ALTRANS websites, and through publication in appropriate print and/or digital media having general circulation across the State.

Following standard processes, including public notice and comment periods, ALDOT's Bureau of Office Engineer will update the State Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) annually to reflect the FTA apportionment for each grant program. The STIP addresses funds by FTA Grant Program and does not list the Program of Projects.

Once the public comment period is complete, the Transit Section initiates a grant application with FTA which includes the development of a Program of Projects (POP). The annual Program of Projects serves as the basis for the State's annual application for current Fiscal Year funds to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

The Program of Projects section of ALDOT's annual FTA application is developed using the project descriptions found in the Subrecipient Applications. The Program of Projects identifies each local subrecipient approved to receive funds for the fiscal year, include a brief project

description, describe the funding amount (Federal and non-Federal), and list the amount of funds identified for state administrative expenses, RTAP, and intercity bus as applicable.

ALDOT certifies annually that it will comply with Federal regulations and other Federally regulated issues, using the FTA Certifications and Assurances for the grant year. The certifications must be completed within 90 days of being published in the Federal Register.

- c. A description of ALDOT's criteria for selecting entities to participate in an FTA grant program.

All project applications will be evaluated to determine the extent to which the proposed project meets overall program goals and objectives of the State and the application criteria set forth by the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT). Rural communities that are not a part of the

urbanized areas of MPOs are included under the jurisdiction of Regional Planning Councils. Consistent with FTA's requirements for regional coordination of various Federally funded transportation programs, ALDOT has designated the 12 Regional Planning Councils to coordinate

transportation services in their regions to ensure that all projects funded under this program are derived from a locally developed, coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan.

Based on the amount of funds appropriated for each program, ALDOT determines the total number of applications to be funded. Applications are reviewed by ALDOT's transit staff, or their designee, to ensure applications are complete and all eligibility requirements are met. Upon

completion of the application evaluation and selection process, award approval letters are sent to successful applicants after FTA approval of an award. Agreements are then entered into with successful agencies. Once the agreement is finalized and approved, the agency becomes a subrecipient of ALDOT.

Unsuccessful applicants are provided notification. This notification outlines reasons why the application was not approved. This information is provided to aid in the development of future applications for assistance.

Projects approved by ALDOT are included in the local Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) as applicable and become part of ALDOT's submission to FTA as the State Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP).

A final list of selected projects for the Sections 5310, 5311, and 5339 programs is published on ALDOT's website.

When a subrecipient is also a direct recipient of FTA funds, the subrecipient/direct recipient reports directly to FTA and ALDOT is not responsible for monitoring

compliance of that subrecipient/direct recipient. A supplemental agreement signed by both entities in their roles as designated recipient and direct recipient relieves ALDOT of this oversight responsibility.

- a. Does the subrecipient operate 50 or more fixed route vehicles in peak service and is it located in a UZA of 200,000 or more people? If no, move to the next question.
 - b. If the subrecipient implemented a fare or major service change since its last Title VI submission, did it conduct an equity analysis in accordance with its Title VI Program?

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

Percent of Population 60 Years and Older










Percent of Population with Salaries below \$25,000








Percent of Population with Salaries Exceeding \$100,000








Percent of Population of High School Graduates






Percent of Population 5 Years and Older Speaks English Less Than "Very Well"





Asian Population as Percent of Census Tract







Hispanic Population as Percent of Census Tract








Native American and Alaskan Population as Percent of Census Tract


Percent of Hispanic Population in Poverty




Percent of Native American and Alaskan Population in Poverty






Total Asian Population in Poverty








Total Native American and Alaskan Population in Poverty





Total Transit Usage by Asian Population







Total Transit Usage by Hispanic Population








Total Transit Usage by Native American and Alaskan Population


