I. Introduction

A. Background

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulates urban stormwater management under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). Urban stormwater collects in, flows through, and discharges from a "municipal separate storm sewer system" (MS4). Thus, EPA refers to the mechanism for regulated urban stormwater management as the "MS4 program." The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) carries out the MS4 program at the state level and regulates urban stormwater management for qualifying public entities in Alabama. (The acronym "MS4" can also refer to such a public entity.)

In 2013, ADEM issued to the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) an individual MS4 permit (NPDES No. ALS000006) covering ALDOT's MS4-applicable activities throughout Alabama. This MS4 permit was designed specifically for ALDOT and replaced regulatory coverage of ALDOT under MS4 permits issued previously. After a full five-year permit term and an administrative continuation, ADEM reissued this MS4 permit to ALDOT with some modifications on September 30, 2019. (Hereinafter, the 2019 version of the MS4 permit will be referred to as simply "the Permit.") The Permit went into effect on October 1, 2019, and was intended to stay in effect for a term of five years (i.e., through September 30, 2024). The Permit was administratively continued by ADEM after that five-year term ended and remains in effect as of the writing of this document.

The Permit applies to areas of the state as specified by Permit item I.A. Requirements of the Permit largely fall under six minimum control measures: Structural Controls Operation, Public Education & Public Involvement (PEPI), Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination (IDDE), Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control, Post-Construction Stormwater Management, and Pollution Prevention / Good Housekeeping (PPGH). In addition, the Permit also contains specific MS4 monitoring requirements.

ALDOT developed a stormwater management program (SWMP) to address the requirements of the Permit and other MS4 stormwater management objectives. The document containing details of the SWMP is the "Stormwater Management Program Plan" (SWMPP). The SWMPP explains the ALDOT MS4 stormwater management activities to be conducted over the Permit term, the ALDOT parties associated with particular activities, the goals corresponding to the activities for the Permit term, and the intended timeframes for the completion of activities. The first version of the SWMPP applicable to the term of the Permit was submitted to ADEM on June 30, 2020. Previously, five revisions of the SWMPP (dated January 29, 2021, April 27, 2021, January 10,

2022, January 30, 2023, and January 30, 2024, respectively) were prepared. MS4-applicable activities performed by ALDOT during Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 pertain to either the January 2023 version or the January 2024 version of the SWMPP, depending on when activities took place. However, these revisions were minor as ALDOT has not modified its SWMP in any substantial way since the development of the first SWMPP version, so the importance of an activity's applicability to a given SWMPP version is small. Another minor SWMPP revision (dated January 30, 2025) has been prepared; it will be in effect during the balance of FY 2025.

B. Purpose of the Annual Report

ALDOT provides updates with respect to SWMPP implementation through annual reporting. As required by Permit item IV.A.1, ALDOT is to submit an annual report to ADEM by January 31 of each year the Permit is in effect. Each annual report is to cover the previous fiscal year (i.e., October 1 – September 30). Generally, the material included in the report is governed by items IV.A.4 and IV.B of the Permit.

This document is the annual report covering FY 2024 (i.e., October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024). MS4-applicable stormwater management actions ALDOT performed during FY 2024 and the statuses of SWMPP-identified activities during FY 2024 are explained in Part II of this report. Part III of this report provides ALDOT's evaluation of its SWMP given actions performed and data collected through the end of FY 2024. In Part IV, the future direction of the SWMP is discussed; the discussion in part addresses modifications made to the SWMPP upon review of FY 2024 activities. Appendices that contain information to supplement Parts II through IV are included in this annual report as well. The appendix structure used in this report is designed to largely mirror that of the SWMPP in order to facilitate connectivity between the SWMPP and this report.

II. Actions Performed & Statuses of Activities during FY 2024

In this section, summaries of FY 2024 actions and statuses are presented for each SWMPP activity category. Emphasis is placed on certain actions and statuses rather than on others, as judged appropriate. A comprehensive list of SWMPP activities with corresponding FY 2024 actions and statuses is provided in Appendix A to supplement the discussion that follows. The list also contains expected tracking data for activities as well as references for finding additional information.

A. Stormwater Management Program Plan

ALDOT modified the SWMPP during FY 2024 by preparing the January 2024 revision, as indicated above. Explanations of those modifications are provided in Part IV of this report.

The timely submission of this annual report will satisfy the annual report submission requirement for Calendar Year 2025. Annual reports for the Permit term to date have been submitted on time.

B. Structural Controls Operation

Though inspections of structural BMP systems and maintenance recommended based on structural BMP inspections were performed prior to FY 2024, no structural BMP systems on inventory were due for inspection during FY 2024. Section II.F below discusses post-construction stormwater management actions as well.

C. Public Education & Public Involvement

ALDOT continued its successful anti-litter public awareness campaign in FY 2024. During FY 2024, 73 radio stations and 14 television stations throughout Alabama broadcasted a campaign public service announcement (PSA). Two messages with PSA-related content were published on the "Drive Safe Alabama" Facebook page, and two PSA-related messages were published on the "Drive Safe Alabama" Twitter (i.e., "X") account. PSA coverage and demographic reach information can be found in Appendix C. Beyond that public awareness campaign, the ALDOT West Central Region brought additional attention to motorist litter issues by holding "Spring Clean Day" in April 2024; the press release issued by ALDOT and a sample article from a media outlet resulting from the press release are provided in Appendix C.

ALDOT also provided ongoing anti-litter public awareness for motorists by means of signage posted on ALDOT roadways throughout the state. During FY 2024, 755 anti-litter signs were active on ALDOT roadways across all ten ALDOT Areas. A breakdown of signs posted by ALDOT Area is given in Appendix C.

ALDOT renewed its agreements with Alabama People Against a Littered State (PALS) and Keep Alabama Beautiful (KALB) to cover FY 2024 and FY 2025; the renewed agreements can be found in Appendix C. ALDOT contributed \$295,000 to PALS and \$250,000 to KALB for FY 2024 activities. Activities conducted by PALS and KALB were in line with expectations set by contracts with ALDOT; Appendix C includes activity reports submitted by PALS and KALB that were reviewed by ALDOT. When ALDOT District personnel noted a litter issue in a particular area, ALDOT followed up with PALS and KALB to determine if litter control activities are being performed in that area. Regarding the PALS Adopt-a-Mile program specifically, 922 parties were active participants performing litter pickup on a total of 934.53 miles of roadway as of the end of FY 2024; a breakdown by ALDOT Region of roads adopted is provided in Appendix C.

Beyond addressing litter, ALDOT continued activities addressing the other target pollutants (i.e., sediment, herbicide, and chemicals and waste materials) as well during FY 2024. ALDOT carried out its Qualified Credentialed Inspector (QCI) training, vegetation management training, and typical good housekeeping training for support facility employees. Outcomes of these training activities are discussed below in Section II.E and Section II.G, and Appendix C provides specific information related to those outcomes.

ALDOT's funding of stormwater management-related university research continued in FY 2024. Ten research projects were actively supported during FY 2024. Appendix C gives a list of

research projects funded by ALDOT during and prior to FY 2024; the total ALDOT funding amount for each supported project is provided.

ALDOT maintained significant interaction with the citizens in communities throughout Alabama during FY 2024. Citizen use of ALDOT's online Environmental Concern Submission Form continued to increase, which ALDOT attributes to the FY 2021 Web site revision that provided heightened visibility and accessibility. One hundred fifty environmental concerns were submitted by citizens using the Environmental Concern Submission Form during FY 2024. Details about the citizen reports and follow-up actions can be found in Appendix C.

ALDOT's use of social media to advance public awareness continued during FY 2024. By the end of FY 2024, all five ALDOT Regions had Twitter (i.e., "X") accounts that, combined, had thousands of followers. Region Twitter accounts posted multiple stormwater/environmental messages during FY 2024. Also, two Regions had Facebook accounts with thousands of followers in total. In addition, the ALDOT-owned "Drive Safe Alabama" Facebook account had thousands of followers during FY 2024, and the "Drive Safe Alabama" Twitter account had hundreds of followers. Appendix C provides more details about ALDOT's FY 2024 social media activities.

Regarding engagement at the local level during FY 2024, one meeting with the Coliseum Boulevard Plume community outreach group was held. ALDOT participated in collaboration opportunities through involvement with the Baldwin County MS4 Planning Committee as well as maintained its anti-litter collaboration with the City of Mobile and Mobile area stakeholders through the Litter-Free Mobile Task Force. Moreover, ALDOT maintained cooperative maintenance agreements with various municipalities and counties so that those local authorities could perform litter pickup on ALDOT property. Additional details about ALDOT's local-level activities are given in Appendix C.

ALDOT continued to be an integral member of the Alabama Stormwater Association (ASA) in FY 2024 by playing a significant role in facilitating two virtual seminars. Two ALDOT employees served on the ASA board of directors during FY 2024. ALDOT's involvement in ASA is further detailed in Appendix C.

ALDOT participated in the environmental-oriented efforts of several professional organizations during FY 2024. Employees represented ALDOT as members of International Erosion Control Association (IECA), the American Society of Civil Engineers, the Alabama Chapter of the Soil and Water Conservation Society, and other organizations. ALDOT participation in professional organizations is further explained in Appendix C.

Regarding additional education opportunities for ALDOT personnel, ALDOT employees participated in at least 20 professional educational events (e.g., conferences, seminars, workshops) during FY 2024. Appendix C provides a table with these events listed and the ALDOT attendance information for each event.

D. Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination

During FY 2024, ALDOT continued its review of the major outfall inventory and continued the major outfall dry-weather screening applicable to the Permit term. Outfalls on inventory in the Jefferson/Shelby County MS4 area as well as for Birmingham Area Office / Birmingham District Office and Calera District Office were reviewed; no major outfalls were added to or removed from the inventory. All accessible major outfalls reviewed were also screened; no possible illicit discharge was observed. A summary of inventory and screening activities relevant to the Permit can be found in Appendix D.

Seven possible illicit discharges were reported to ALDOT personnel by citizens, and one additional possible discharge was detected by ALDOT personnel. Details about the citizen concern submissions can be found in the environmental concerns log given in Appendix C. The possible illicit discharges were addressed in accordance with the SWMPP.

E. Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control

In FY 2024, ALDOT continued to oversee Construction General Permit coverage and compliance as described in the SWMPP. There were 19 active, permitted construction projects in MS4 areas during FY 2024. Those projects are listed in a table provided in Appendix E.

ALDOT received four concern reports relating to construction site stormwater runoff control during FY 2024. Two concerns were not related to ALDOT construction activity, and the other two concerns were addressed in accordance with the SWMPP. More details about the concerns are given in the environmental concerns report log in Appendix C.

As noted in Section II.C above, QCI training was conducted during FY 2024. ALDOT facilitated QCI recertification training for 354 employees and 172 other individuals over four virtual sessions as well as provided the means for 64 employees to obtain initial QCI certification. More information about QCI training is provided in Appendix C.

F. Post-Construction Stormwater Management

As noted above in Section II.B, no structural BMP systems on inventory were due for inspection during FY 2024. However, BMP systems were added to inventory during FY 2024, as appropriate and in accordance with the SWMPP.

G. Pollution Prevention / Good Housekeeping

Eighteen support facilities were inspected during FY 2024, and the deficiencies noted during inspections were resolved or are in the process of resolution in accordance with facility SPCC Plans. The facility inspections performed and deficiencies observed during inspections are summarized in a table included in Appendix G. No significant revision of the ALDOT-wide support facility SPCC program was made during FY 2024, and no individual facility SPCC Plan was significantly revised.

With respect to support facility good housekeeping training, sessions covering SPCC, universal waste, GHS, and other related topics were conducted at ALDOT support facilities during FY 2024. Appendix C provides a table that indicates the dates of sessions held at specific support facilities for particular types of training along with the number of employees attending each session.

Regarding transportation facility PPGH, applicable maintenance activities (i.e., litter pickup, snow and ice control, drainage structure maintenance, erosion control, and herbicide treatment and surveillance) continued to be performed in manners intended to reduce the potential for negative stormwater runoff impacts during FY 2024. Of note, full-width litter pickup was performed on 6,146.58 shoulder miles throughout Alabama, and 3,726 instances of spot litter pickup occurred as indicated by completed work reports. Other total activity work amounts are given in a table in Appendix G.

As noted above in Section II.C, vegetation management training continued throughout FY 2024. Nine sessions of the vegetation management training course were held for 236 ALDOT and 80 non-ALDOT participants in all. Details about individual vegetation management training course sessions are provided in a table in Appendix C. Agendas for this training (for Calendar Years 2023 and 2024) are also provided in Appendix C. Four vegetation management training newsletters were distributed during FY 2024. In addition, a total of 32 employees over seven sessions held during FY 2024 participated in the "Review for Commercial Applicator Examination" course.

H. MS4 Monitoring

In FY 2024, ALDOT continued field implementation of the MS4 monitoring visual observation strategy. Two dry-weather observations and one wet-weather observation were conducted at all six selected monitoring locations in accordance with the visual observation strategy developed. Observation outcomes continued to indicate that runoff flow paths on ALDOT property are well-vegetated overall and do not experience noteworthy erosion. Thus, the monitoring efforts have produced no evidence that ALDOT is a significant contributor to the pollution of waters for which sediment or turbidity is a pollutant of concern. More details about the MS4 monitoring activities conducted during FY 2024 are provided in Appendix H.

III. Evaluation of the Stormwater Management Program

The proficiency that ALDOT demonstrated in conducting MS4 activities throughout the five-year Permit term indicates that ALDOT is experiencing sustained SWMP success which began in the previous MS4 permit term and was carried over to the term of the Permit. Also, ADEM conducted a comprehensive audit of ALDOT's SWMP during FY 2021 that resulted in no significant program deficiencies being noted, further validating the sustained success of the SWMP.

ALDOT's evaluation of its MS4 program based on the accomplishments of the five-year Permit term follows.

A. Overall Program Compliance Status

Actions expected by either the Permit or the SWMPP to be performed during FY 2024 and during the previous years of the Permit term were performed by ALDOT when possible. The COVID-19 pandemic prevented some activities from taking place and reduced the amounts of other activities performed, but the pandemic caused no unmitigated compliance issues during the Permit term.

B. Major Findings Resulting from the Program

The ALDOT PEPI program continues to be robust. The anti-litter public awareness campaign, anti-litter signage, and fully-deployed watershed boundary signage are strategically targeting citizen motorists at a large scale. The accomplishments of PALS and KALB demonstrate the importance of ALDOT's ongoing support of external anti-litter campaigns to supplement ALDOT's own anti-litter efforts. ALDOT's online exposure and communication via social media with the public continue to increase. The major revision of the ALDOT Web site during FY 2021 was a significant step forward in terms of functional online connection with citizens, as evidenced by the remarkable uptick in citizens using the Environmental Concern Submission Form. ALDOT continues to connect with citizens and with other MS4s at the local level through partnerships such as the Litter-Free Mobile Task Force and through participation in organizations like the Alabama Stormwater Association. The established QCI training and vegetation management training conducted by ALDOT continues to be set up to provide both employees and non-employees training well-regarded by the stormwater professional community.

Findings from environmental concerns submitted by citizens, major outfall screening, and good housekeeping on ALDOT property continue to indicate no major or widespread deficiencies in ALDOT MS4 stormwater management practices. The visual observation strategy for MS4 monitoring is, to date, providing additional support that ALDOT's stormwater management practices are sufficient in preventing pollutants of concern from entering natural waters.

C. Program Strengths & Weaknesses

Well-established, MS4-applicable activities continue to be noteworthy strengths of the ALDOT SWMP. In particular, education of employees, education of the public, involvement with the public, construction stormwater management, PPGH for transportation facilities, and IDDE-motivated major outfall inventory and screening are typically conducted in highly proficient manners and usually achieve expected outcomes or even outcomes beyond those that are required by the Permit. PPGH procedures for ALDOT support facilities continue to be implemented smoothly overall under the formalization that took place during the previous MS4 permit term.

With fully operational BMPs on the post-construction stormwater management BMP inventory, the first official inspections of BMPs occurred during FY 2023. The outcomes of the BMP inspections provide validation of the viability of the inspection procedures in assessing the condition of a given BMP. Further implementation of the procedures is needed to determine if they are indeed adequate for the broad spectrum of BMPs that will be fully operational in time.

Field implementation of the visual observation strategy for MS4 monitoring has shown promise. ALDOT has seen the advantages of examining monitoring locations from a "big picture" perspective rather than trying to discern ALDOT's contribution or lack of contribution to receiving water pollution based on noisy numerical data.

D. Overall Program Effectiveness

No evidence has emerged to refute ALDOT's prior assessment that its established SWMP practices are meeting MS4 regulatory requirements as well as ALDOT's stormwater management objectives in a sustained manner.

IV. Future Direction of the Program

ALDOT has no reason to develop a major revision of the June 2020 version of the SWMPP given the sustained success of the ALDOT MS4 program and an expected MS4 permit reissuance with the five-year Permit term now completed. However, relatively minor SWMPP modifications are needed occasionally, which is why two revisions of the SWMPP were prepared during FY 2021, one revision was prepared during FY 2022, one revision was prepared during FY 2023, one revision was prepared during FY 2024, and another revision is being submitted with this annual report. Modifications made in the January 2024 revision of the SWMPP were discussed in the FY 2023 annual report. The SWMPP modifications made since the January 2024 revision are the following:

- updates of statuses of activities in light of FY 2024 outcomes,
- updates of ALDOT MS4 point-of-contact information because of personnel reassignments that occurred,
- the renewed PALS and KALB agreements discussed in Section II.C, and
- corrections of any detected inadvertent misstatements, grammatical issues, and aesthetic issues.

ALDOT will modify the SWMPP again appropriately as other needs arise.








TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (WIAT) — ALDO T work crews spent Tuesday picking up 400 bags of litter they collected along Highway 69 South all the way to the Hale County line, it's the annual spring clean up project.

ALDOT spokesperson John McWilliams says the goal is to promote cleaner and safer roadways. 100 ALDOT workers participated in the litter clean up operation.

"We want to bring awareness about litter in Alabama, and it's something that can easily be fixed, but it's going to take everyone of us to do our part to make sure our roadways stay clear of litter," said McWilliams.

AGREEMENT

ALABAMA PALS (People Against a Littered State)

AND

STATE OF ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the Alabama PALS (People Against a Littered State), hereinafter referred to as PALS, and the Alabama Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as (ALDOT), for the purposes expressed herein whereas, the parties desire to engage in public promotion of the ALDOT Adopt-a-Mile program. Now, therefore, the parties, in consideration of the premises herein, do agree as follows:

Alabama PALS will:

- (1) Oversee and promote the Alabama PALS City and County Chapters Network.
- (2) Produce quarterly newsletters for Adopt-a-Mile.
- (3) Produce Adopt-a-Mile Brochures with applications.
- (4) Print, label, mail and distribute Adopt-a-Mile quarterly newsletters and brochures.
- (5) Producing public service announcements for the Adopt-a-Mile Program in accordance with the total yearly budget and services listed below:

Total Yearly Budget for Public Service Announcements \$25,000.00

- a) Filming and Editing of .30 PSA (Beta Format)
- b) In Town Travel
- c) Out of Town Travel (1 day)
- d) Purchase & Copying of three (3) 3/4" Format Tapes
- e) Purchase & Copying of two (2) VHS Format Tapes
- f) Seven (7) DVD Copies (TV)
- g) One Hundred and Eighty (180) CDs for Radio
- h) Forty-four (44) Beta SP Copies (TV)
- i) Seven (7) DVD Pro Copies (TV)
- j) MP3 Copy for ABA (for AA Web Page) Allowance for additional Copies for Chapters, etc.
- k) Three (3) Month Contract with Alabama Broadcaster's Association
- (6) Notify all Adopt-a-Mile participants of PALS statewide events such as Statewide Spring Cleanup.
- (7) Submit quarterly itemized invoices, along with all supporting documentation, covering the actual costs of providing public promotion of the ALDOT Adopt-a-Mile Program. Invoices should be submitted to: Maintenance Engineer, Dept. of Transportation, 1409 Coliseum Blvd., Montgomery, AL 36110.

- (8) Provide two full-time employees to be fully supported by Alabama PALS. These employees will serve as liaisons to ALDOT to ensure that the program is fully serviced to provide exposure statewide, as well as ensuring that maximum compliance of the program is serviced, including the following:
 - a) State Adopt-a-Mile Director.
 - b) State Adopt-a-Mile Coordinator.
 - c) These two employees shall also:
 - 1) Oversee the maintenance and compliance of miles adopted through the Alabama Adopt-a-Mile program.
 - 2) Perform annual site visits, in-person or through the County PALS Chapters, of one-third (¹/₃) of all known current recorded Adopt-a-Miles on federal and/or state routes to determine which groups and individuals are currently maintaining their respective miles. This will result in all Adopt-a-Mile locations being inspected at least once in every three-year period. Produce, distribute and maintain records for all miles that are inspected in each county. This list should be provided at least quarterly to ALDOT.
 - 3) Keep records of miles that are not being maintained and contact "adoptees" to determine if the group or individual wishes to remain in the Adopt-a-Mile program. In the next two newsletters PALS will include that ALL Adopt-a-Mile participants must provide to PALS current information including address, phone number, approximate number of participants, and whether they wish to continue participation in the Adopt-a-Mile program no later than May 31, 2024. All participants who fail to notify PALS by this date will be declared inactive. PALS must notify ALDOT in its July quarterly report of all inactive participants for sign removal.
 - 4) Provide list to ALDOT quarterly of miles that are not being maintained on a regular basis.
 - 5) Provide a list quarterly of all Adopt-a-Mile signs that need to be removed for failure to comply with the requirements of the program.
 - 6) Recruit new "adoptees" for miles where signs have been removed.

Programs Coordinated:

Adopt-a-Mile Adopt-a-Stream Statewide "Don't Drop It On Alabama" Spring Cleanup Alabama Coastal Cleanup Annual Awards Program

- (9) Providing a written report quarterly to ALDOT of the PALS activities to include:
 - a) Listing of new participants & miles adopted
 - b) Listing and date of contacts made
 - c) Listing of groups terminating participation
 - d) Report of statewide mailings
 - e) Listing of all public service announcements that ran including which stations and dates and times

- (10) Obtain or fabricate signs that meet ALDOT specifications for signage for local routes and provide signs for adopted county routes. These signs should be shipped at the lowest United States Postal Rate to the District Office listed on the Adopt-a-Mile application.
- (11) Review Adopt-a-Mile applications to ensure that they are in final form before submitting them to ALDOT District Office.
- (12) Maintain the Adopt-a-Mile database and provide at least quarterly to ALDOT or upon request at the same time providing the quarterly report.
- (13) Provide safety vests in accordance with ALDOT's most current Guidelines for Operations (latest adopted version), for all individuals participating in the Adopt-a-Mile litter campaign. PALS will be responsible for informing all Adopt-a-Mile groups that all participants are required to wear these safety vests at any time they are picking up trash on the right-of-way. This notification must take place no later than January 1, 2024.

ALDOT will:

- (14) Oversee the Adopt-a-Mile program.
- (15) Process the Adopt-a-Mile applications.
- (16) Erect Adopt-a-Mile signs on State routes in accordance with the ALDOT Adopt-a-Mile program.
- (17) Provide litterbags for Adopt-a-Mile participants as required.
- (18) Provide removal and disposal of litter collected by Adopt-a-Mile participants as required.
- (19) Reimburse Alabama PALS a maximum of two hundred and ninety-five thousand dollars (\$295, 000.00) for each fiscal year in accordance with the proposed budget listed below:

Alabama PALS agrees that all promotional materials and programs must receive final approval of ALDOT prior to distribution or implementation.

Alabama PALS agrees that all reimbursed expenses will be for those expenses solely expended for the public promotion of the ALDOT Adopt-a-Mile program.

- (20) It is agreed that the terms and commitments contained herein shall not be constituted as a debt of the State of Alabama in violation of Article 11, Section 213 of the Constitution of Alabama 1901, as amended by Amendment Number 26. It is further agreed that if any provision of this Agreement shall contravene any statute or Constitutional provision of amendment, either now in effect of which may, during the course of this Agreement, be enacted, then the conflicting provision in the Agreement shall be deemed null and void.
- (21) If the Agreement term is to exceed more than one fiscal year, then said Agreement is subject to termination in the event that funds should not be appropriated for the continued payment of the Agreement in subsequent fiscal years. In the event of proration of the fund, from which payment under this Agreement is to be made, Agreement will be subject to termination. This Agreement can be terminated by either party upon thirty days written notice to the other party.
- (22) In the event of any dispute between the parties, senior officials of both parties shall meet and engage in a good faith attempt to resolve the dispute. Should that effort fail, and the dispute involves the payment of money, a party's sole remedy is the filing of a claim with the Board of Adjustment of the State of Alabama. For any other disputes arising under the terms of this Agreement which are not resolved by negotiation, the parties agree to utilize appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution including, but not limited to, mediation. Such dispute resolution shall occur in Montgomery, Alabama utilizing where appropriate, mediators selected from the roster of mediators maintained by the Center for Dispute Resolution of the Alabama State Bar.
- (23) Alabama PALS, its employees, agents, successors, assigned, contractors, or subcontractors shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, Alabama Department of Transportation and their officials, employees, contractors, servants, or agents, in both their official and individual capacities, from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, actions, causes of actions, losses or expenses of any nature whatsoever, regulatory actions, administrative actions, quasi-administrative or quasi-judicial actions or procedures, State, Federal or otherwise, of any nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, including but not limited to compensatory damages, punitive damages, damages for any injury to person or property, tangible or intangible, or any form of monetary or compensatory relief declaratory or injunctive relief, or any form of relief or remedy of any nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, or attorney fees, costs, or expenses, caused by or rising out of, resulting from or in any way related to the performance of any work, conduct or activity performed or failed to be performed by the Alabama PALS in connection with the performance of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- (24) By entering into this agreement, Alabama PALS is not an agent of the State, its officers, employees, agents or assigns. Alabama PALS is an independent entity from the State and nothing in this agreement creates an agency relationship between the parties.
- (25) The Alabama PALS and its employee(s) will not be subject to the provisions of, nor entitled to, the benefits of the State merit law or State employee benefits, including State employee health insurance.

- (26) The Alabama PALS will permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as may be determined by the State of Alabama Department of Transportation to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with its instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the Alabama PALS shall so certify to the State of Alabama Department of Transportation and shall set forth what efforts he has made to obtain the information.
- (27) By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.
- (28) In compliance with Act 2016-312, the Contractor is not currently engaged in, and will not engage in, the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with which this state can enjoy open trade.
- (29) THIS AGREEMENT is in effect for the period beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2025.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed by their respective officials thereunto duly authorized, the Agreement to be effective on the approval date by the Governor of Alabama.

Specifics as Related to the Contract October 1, 2023-September 30, 2025 First Quarter Reporting Period 10/01/2023 – 12/30/2023

The contract for 2023-2025 between Alabama PALS and ALDOT was finalized and received by Alabama PALS in July 2023 and includes components which both parties feel will best benefit the growth and maintenance of these valuable statewide programs.

ALDOT and PALS have made final changes to a new and more information specific database, which will be kept and updated by Alabama PALS. (See Database Below). This database upgrade has afforded PALS a better and more efficient way in which to monitor compliance for the program, keep better contact with the volunteer adoptees, as well as beginning and creating and implementing a new and efficient inspection process for the program.

All new data received from this point forward should reflect accurate information for each adopted mile. The database is now updated with the ability to view exact numbers and locations of State, Federal, and County adopted miles. (Total miles and groups included in report).

PALS continues to receive aa extremely high level of responses and new applications (see attachments) for Adopt-a-Mile and Adopt-a-Stream programs during the Second Quarter of 2022-2023. A new Compliance Reporting Form has been included in the PALS / Adopt-a-Mile Newsletter, where groups, individuals, PALS Chapters and others can report a group that is not keeping their respective mile of highway cleaned on a regular basis.

2023 Alabama PALS Statewide Governor's Awards Program

The 2023 Governor's Awards Program was held on November 08, 2023. Over 260 leaders, state agency heads, volunteers, city and county representatives attended the 2023 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards Program. 34 Awards were presented.

The 2024 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards are scheduled for November 12, 2024.

New Adoptees and Miles Adopted 10/01/23-12/30/23 (see Attached List)

Attached list of AAM applications and signs erected is attached to this report. Reports for all applications, signs mailed and erected are included in each quarterly report.

2023 was the fastest growing AAM period to date.

New ALDOT specified Safety Vests are available for all adoptees on State and Federal highways, and notices have been sent to all AAM participants regarding the availability of vests.

Adopt-a-Mile Signs to be Replaced

PALS continues to send letters to ALDOT District Engineers regarding the replacement of respective signs for each district, and will continue to follow up on future sign replacement as the requests come into the PALS office. As data is updated and added to the new AAM database, Christy will continue to correspond with all ALDOT district office in regard to removal or replacement of AAM signs. Several signs have been replaced during this period.

ALDOT District Correspondence

PALS remains in touch with ALDOT District Offices regarding the new protocol for the Adopta-Mile program. Christy feels like all districts are excited about the protocol for the program and feel like having PALS handle all paperwork and signage enables the adoptees to receive the signs in a timely fashion.

Ongoing contact is made with respective District Offices regarding applications, paperwork and erecting of AAM signs. District Offices of ALDOT have been very willing to assist the PALS office in all aspects.

PALS would like to encourage all ALDOT offices to report to the PALS office, all miles that appear to be picked up on a regular basis, or signs that have faded and become unable to read. PALS will contact the respective group.

Proposal for Updating Adopt-a-Mile Procedures

PALS met with Stacey Swindall in late September 2022 to discuss the need to have all AAM documents and applications accepted with signatures for E-sign program. All documents would be emailed to groups and individuals for E-signatures, then emailed to all ALDOT District Engineers for E-Signature, therefore eliminating documents having to be mailed and eliminating paperwork for ALDOT Engineers. This would also speed up time for the volunteers to receive their AAM signs in the future.

Also discussed during meeting was the need to go to a web-based database for the Adopt-a-Mile Program for the future. PALS has discussed this with Todd Jones with ALDOT and can be developed for future use.

Stacy Swindall is working with PALS to move both of these proposals forward.

PALS met with Stacey Swindall on July 7, 2022, to discuss new wordage on all new AAM applications, as well as moving ahead with proposed Docusign use on AAM applications in the future. Upon final approval, PALS will make all necessary changes to have the forms and applications emailed to ALDOT engineers using Docusign to aid in the elimination of paperwork, as well as speed up the application process for volunteer groups.

The discussion also included the use of ALDOT spec safety vests for volunteer use during cleanups held on US and State Highways. PALS will order the ALDOT spec vests moving forward.

During the meeting, Todd Jones with ALDOT updated the attendees of the positive attributes of going to a web based database for the Adopt-a-Mile program. The project will move forward with input form PALS and ALDOT, and the new database should be completed by early summer of 2023.

Todd Jones / ALDOT gave an update of web-based database for Alabama PALS through and email to Stacey Swindall and PALS staff in August 2022 stating that project had begun and target date would be spring/summer 2023.

Christy Waddell, State Adopt-a-Mile Coordinator, has implemented several new items for maintaining compliance, updates, and correspondence with current and future Adopt-a-Mile participating groups. One is a brochure (enclosed) that will be sent to each adoptee upon their 2-year anniversary with the program. This will indicate if the group still intends to actively participate or be removed from the active roll. Christy is also working to identify additional miles from past years that are not actively participating or are in need of new and updated signage.

The 2023 "Don't Drop it on Alabama" Statewide Cleanup

The 2023 Spring Cleanup was held in April 2023, with some counties extending their respective cleanups in May, June and July 2023. PALS will continue to work with the Association of County Commissions to continue cleanups in 67 counties.

Over 500 tons have reported as picked up during the 2023 cleanup effort to date, with several counties completing cleanup efforts in July. Reports are still being received and PALS will work with each city, county or volunteer group to give them additional time to participate if needed.

All materials and supplies were distributed statewide for the 2023 Spring Cleanup

In 2022, the Alabama Community College Systems partnered with local communities to extend the cleanup of all ACCS campuses and respective communities. This partnership continued in 2023.

PALS had to order additional bags for the 2023 statewide cleanup effort due to higher than normal demand for materials and supplies.

The 2024 "Don't Drop It On Alabama" Spring Cleanup will begin in April 2024.

Supplies and Materials have been ordered for the 2024 statewide cleanup.

PALS / ALDOT Public Service Announcement

The 2023 PALS/ALDOT PSA through ABA began airtime in June, July and August 2023.

As in past years, air time and scheduling reports from the ABA will be included in ALDOT reports for that time period.

PALS has uploaded the new ALDOT anti-littering PSA on the PALS webpage and Facebook page.

PALS and ABA are working to produce a new PALS PSA for 2024, which will begin airing in June 2024.

Database for Adopt-a-Mile Program (updated copy on jump drive included in this report)

The Adopt-a-Mile database is now current and working effectively. PALS is currently able to view total, exact number of groups and adopted miles by County, State and Federal miles. PALS continues to work with Todd Jones of ALDOT to ensure that the database is working correctly and enabling PALS to best use the database for the benefit of the AAM program.

PALS continues to provide all database updates to ALDOT on a quarterly basis.

PALS continues to add/delete and change information to the new Adopt-a-Mile database as updated information is collected. In addition to daily attention to the database, a file system has been created and maintained to assist in the creation of an accurate account of all County, State and Federal adopted miles in the future.

2023 Adopt-a-Mile Inspections

The internship program has proven highly effective and will continue each year as specified in the PALS / ALDOT contract.

All new data from the Intern AAM Inspection Program reports will be added to the PALS / AAM database, reflecting and changes, additions, or deletions from current database.

The South Zone will be the focus for the 2023 Inspection program.

The 2023 Adopt A Mile inspections have been completed and were inspected by Osprey Initiative, which is a partner of Alabama PALS and employs college graduates and students that are completing their Masters degree at South Alabama University etc. The inspections in the South Zone were completed in early September 2023 and are included on the enclosed updated data base. A high level of focus was placed on inspecting and rating each mile, but Osprey also focused on old or signs that need to be removed or updated. Pictures of all miles were submitted to PALS, as well as a litter rating for the respective miles.

The partnership with Osprey proved to be the most effective and thorough inspection to date.

PALS will inspect all adopted miles in the Central Zone in 2024.

EDUCATING YOUNG LEADERS ON LITTER CLEANUP

Happy 2024! The fall was a very busy time for the Alabama PALS Clean Campus Program. I visited nearly 20 schools in person, Zoomed with a few more, and had meetings with various other groups around the state to help spread our anti-litter message. I spoke to thousands of students from August to December sharing why we need to all do a little bit each day to keep our beautiful state free from litter.

Two schools I visited this fall were Kinston School in Coffee County and Fairfax Elementary School in Chambers County. At Kinston, I met with 200 students in an assembly aimed at teaching the students how to be lifelong stewards of our environment. I challenged the students to look out the windows on their way home and really see the litter on the side of the road. I asked them to imagine how all that litter got there and how it may or may not ever get picked up. I suggested they start a habit now of picking up at least one piece of litter every day, because we can all make a big differ-

ence when we all do our part!

At Fairfax Elementary School, I met with their student government group. I reminded this group that they are the leaders of the school, and when they are seen doing the "right thing" by picking up litter, the other students will notice. I challenged this group to spread the anti-litter message to their fellow students by not only being an example but also by telling a few friends what all we discussed.

This spring, we hope to visit at least 20 more schools and would love to come to your town! MAKING A DIFFERENCE OVER A BIG AREA



Paulina Vives-Phillips and her beagle, Lucky

Paulina Vives-Phillips moved to the Wakefield area of Marshall County four years ago and she has been making an impact on her community just about ever since.

She lives on Murphy Hill Road and she noticed her road — which is something of a tourist area — was badly littered. Paulina set out to do something about it.

"I picked up the loop of Murphy Hill Road, Mt. Moriah Road and South Sauty

Road," she said. It took her a year of regular pick-ups multiple times a week to get it done, picking up small sections at a time.

Her faithful beagle, "Lucky," makes every step she makes on these litter cleaning journeys and it was actually Lucky who indirectly led to the litter pick-ups in the first place.

"I took Lucky for a walk and saw the litter," Paulina said. "That was the inspiration for it."

Paulina initially thought she'd pick up the loop one time and things would change. She thought it would stay clean. She thought neighbors would see her picking up and start picking up themselves or at the very least stop littering.

But that wasn't what happened. It got littered again almost as soon as she was finished. But the subsequent rounds around the loop weren't near as bad as the first one. The litter hadn't had as much time to accumulate.

She expanded her pick-ups along South Sauty Road all the way into Jackson County, where it turns into County Highway 67. She also picked up along Highway 227 to the State Park. It's a huge territory that she picks up litter on.

So the clean-up job she started 4 years ago continues to this day. She picks up at least 2 or 3 days a week and picks up for 2 to 3 hours on each trip.

Lucky is a 15-inch beagle, not a large dog but certainly not a small dog either, and he can be bundle of energy. Paulina keeps him on a long leash when she's picking up litter.

For that reason, she doesn't carry a large litter bag. She saves her small Walmart bags, carries them in a small backpack and will fill 17 or 18 of the small bags with trash on a typical pickup day.

She doesn't use a "litter grabber" stick either. She started out bare handing the trash she encountered. A neighbor who saw her couldn't stand to see her doing that and gave her a pair of gloves.

"I wore those gloves out and I am on my second pair now," she said.

Litter clean-up makes a difference in how a neighborhood looks, but it's no picnic on its best day. And it can be pretty bad on its worst days. Paulina has had at least a couple of scary incidents.

"Another dog attacked Lucky one day, and put a hole in his side," she said. There was no way Lucky could walk back home. It could've made the hole bigger. Paulina called her husband Ben and he came

and picked them up. Lucky ended up at a veterinary urgent care to get stitched up.

On another day, a broken bottle in Paulina's bag brushed her leg and gashed it open. Again, she had to call her husband to come pick her up.

"He asked me once, 'Why are you doing this?'" Paulina said. Her reply was that it's good exercise for her, good exercise for Lucky and it helps the environment.

She has never figured up the miles or the number of bags she has picked up, although she plans to start doing that. She is now part of PALS — People Against a Littered State — and they like to track the difference their cleaning efforts are making.

"I'm not able to catch up," Paulina said.
"My dream was to finish it. I am so naïve,
honestly. I thought people were going to
get motivated. If they don't get motivated, I
thought, they will at least feel sorry for us."

She finds all kinds of litter, plastic bottles, aluminum cans and fast food wrappers being the main offenders.

"Mountain Dew bottles are my archenemy," she said. "They're green and you really have to look to see them in the grass."

The most embarrassing material she found was "adult material" scattered on the roadside.

"My 15-year-old nephew was visiting and that made it really embarrassing," she said.

The scariest item was one totally unexpected. She picked up a bag that was heavy and she had to look inside. There was a deer head in the bag.

"It scared me to death," she said.

Her imagination sometimes runs wild during her litter work.

"I make up little stories about the litter I find," she said. "Like the adult material. Was it an angry wife who found it in the vehicle and threw it out the window?"

She regularly finds "99 Bananas" liqueur bottles on her route.

"I don't know who this guy is, but he likes it and you can track him by his bottles," she said. Has she found any money?

"In four years, I have probably found \$22 or \$23," she said. "When people stop by, they say, 'Why are you doing this?' I say 'Because every time I come out here, I find a \$20 bill.' I've tried everything to get people to pick up."

Cigarette butts are a bane to litter cleaners in town. Paulina said they're bad in the country too.

She is becoming more than just a litter cleaner now. She is becoming an anti-litter advocate. She addressed the Jackson County Commission, encouraging them to put out more roadside garbage cans, more signs and begin a campaign to encourage people to pick up in front of their own homes and businesses. She plans to speak to the Marshall County Commission about the same thing.

"I lived in Japan for several years," she said. "There, everyone keeps things clean in front of their own place. I don't know why we can't do that here."

She was a coordinator of various Patriotic events at Red Level High School, Buck Creek Church, and probably more of those that I don't know. She always wanted to make sure my children knew exactly what the meanings were behind Independence Day, Memorial Day, and Veterans Day. She always inquired if they were being taught this in school and the fact it was not just another day off. She loved the "Red, White, and Blue."

My :Memama was a Servant. This is an understatement. It was such a wonderful gift from God to have a woman whose primary spiritual gift was "Acts of Service" matched to such organizations and ideas that would help more people than herself. PALS, being the "Trash Lady", Red Cross, "being the Blood Lady", "the Commissioner's wife", the right-hand lady to help her husband, Johnny, making sure that his people were loved and cared for beyond their roads and community. I have asked her numerous times how many cream cheese pound cakes she's baked and delivered over her lifetime. She always just sort of had a quiet laugh because she'd lost count too. The servant and volunteer list could go on and on. Memama sometimes had a "way" of how she executed ideas—trust me, I know; however, I always knew and will forever remember that anything she wanted to accomplish was based on doing the right thing for a greater cause.

In closing, when Memama was lying there before she entered the pearly gates of Heaven, I told her that she was going to have to find a new servant job. There would be no trash in Heaven and no need for blood drives! However, I know she is putting to use the old hymns she had memorized and sang throughout my childhood. And maybe, just maybe, she is singing in one of Heaven's many choirs in the alto section, accompanied there to har left by my sweet mother, her daughter, Janna.

I love you Memama- you will always be in my heart and soul, and you have done your job here to teach me what it means to be more than a Memama.

Specifics as Related to the Contract October 1, 2023-September 30, 2025 Second Quarter Reporting Period 01/01/2024 – 03/31/2024

The contract for 2023-2025 between Alabama PALS and ALDOT was finalized and received by Alabama PALS in July 2023 and includes components which both parties feel will best benefit the growth and maintenance of these valuable statewide programs.

ALDOT and PALS have made final changes to a new and more information specific database, which will be kept and updated by Alabama PALS. (See Database Below). This database upgrade has afforded PALS a better and more efficient way in which to monitor compliance for the program, keep better contact with the volunteer adoptees, as well as beginning and creating and implementing a new and efficient inspection process for the program.

All new data received from this point forward should reflect accurate information for each adopted mile. The database is now updated with the ability to view exact numbers and locations of State, Federal, and County adopted miles. (Total miles and groups included in report).

PALS continues to receive aa **extremely high** level of responses and new applications (**see attachments**) for Adopt-a-Mile and Adopt-a-Stream programs during the Second Quarter of 2022-2023. A new Compliance Reporting Form has been included in the PALS / Adopt-a-Mile Newsletter, where groups, individuals, PALS Chapters and others can report a group that is not keeping their respective mile of highway cleaned on a regular basis.

2023 Alabama PALS Statewide Governor's Awards Program

The 2023 Governor's Awards Program was held on November 08, 2023. Over 260 leaders, state agency heads, volunteers, city and county representatives attended the 2023 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards Program. 34 Awards were presented.

The 2024 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards are scheduled for November 12, 2024.

New Adoptees and Miles Adopted 12/01/24-03/31//24 (see Attached List)

Attached list of AAM applications and signs erected is attached to this report. Reports for all applications, signs mailed and erected are included in each quarterly report.

2023 was the fastest growing AAM period to date.

New ALDOT specified Safety Vests are available for all adoptees on State and Federal highways, and notices have been sent to all AAM participants regarding the availability of vests.

Adopt-a-Mile Signs to be Replaced

PALS continues to send letters to ALDOT District Engineers regarding the replacement of respective signs for each district, and will continue to follow up on future sign replacement as the requests come into the PALS office. As data is updated and added to the new AAM database, Christy will continue to correspond with all ALDOT district office in regard to removal or replacement of AAM signs. Several signs have been replaced during this period.

ALDOT District Correspondence

PALS remains in touch with ALDOT District Offices regarding the new protocol for the Adopta-Mile program. Christy feels like all districts are excited about the protocol for the program and feel like having PALS handle all paperwork and signage enables the adoptees to receive the signs in a timely fashion.

Ongoing contact is made with respective District Offices regarding applications, paperwork and erecting of AAM signs. District Offices of ALDOT have been very willing to assist the PALS office in all aspects.

PALS would like to encourage all ALDOT offices to report to the PALS office, all miles that appear to be picked up on a regular basis, or signs that have faded and become unable to read. PALS will contact the respective group.

Proposal for Updating Adopt-a-Mile Procedures

PALS met with Stacey Swindall in late September 2022 to discuss the need to have all AAM documents and applications accepted with signatures for E-sign program. All documents would be emailed to groups and individuals for E-signatures, then emailed to all ALDOT District Engineers for E-Signature, therefore eliminating documents having to be mailed and eliminating paperwork for ALDOT Engineers. This would also speed up time for the volunteers to receive their AAM signs in the future.

Also discussed during meeting was the need to go to a web-based database for the Adopt-a-Mile Program for the future. PALS has discussed this with Todd Jones with ALDOT and can be developed for future use.

Stacy Swindall is working with PALS to move both of these proposals forward.

PALS met with Stacey Swindall on July 7, 2022, to discuss new wordage on all new AAM applications, as well as moving ahead with proposed Docusign use on AAM applications in the future. Upon final approval, PALS will make all necessary changes to have the forms and applications emailed to ALDOT engineers using Docusign to aid in the elimination of paperwork, as well as speed up the application process for volunteer groups.

The discussion also included the use of ALDOT spec safety vests for volunteer use during cleanups held on US and State Highways. PALS will order the ALDOT spec vests moving forward.

During the meeting, Todd Jones with ALDOT updated the attendees of the positive attributes of going to a web based database for the Adopt-a-Mile program. The project will move forward with input form PALS and ALDOT, and the new database should be completed by early summer of 2023.

Todd Jones / ALDOT gave an update of web-based database for Alabama PALS through and email to Stacey Swindall and PALS staff in August 2022 stating that project had begun and target date would be spring/summer 2023.

Christy Waddell, State Adopt-a-Mile Coordinator, has implemented several new items for maintaining compliance, updates, and correspondence with current and future Adopt-a-Mile participating groups. One is a brochure (enclosed) that will be sent to each adoptee upon their 2-year anniversary with the program. This will indicate if the group still intends to actively participate or be removed from the active roll. Christy is also working to identify additional miles from past years that are not actively participating or are in need of new and updated signage.

The 2023 "Don't Drop it on Alabama" Statewide Cleanup

The 2023 Spring Cleanup was held in April 2023, with some counties extending their respective cleanups in May, June and July 2023. PALS will continue to work with the Association of County Commissions to continue cleanups in 67 counties.

Over 500 tons have reported as picked up during the 2023 cleanup effort to date, with several counties completing cleanup efforts in July. Reports are still being received and PALS will work with each city, county or volunteer group to give them additional time to participate if needed.

All materials and supplies were distributed statewide for the 2023 Spring Cleanup

In 2022, the Alabama Community College Systems partnered with local communities to extend the cleanup of all ACCS campuses and respective communities. This partnership continued in 2023.

During the meeting, Todd Jones with ALDOT updated the attendees of the positive attributes of going to a web based database for the Adopt-a-Mile program. The project will move forward with input form PALS and ALDOT, and the new database should be completed by early summer of 2023.

Todd Jones / ALDOT gave an update of web-based database for Alabama PALS through and email to Stacey Swindall and PALS staff in August 2022 stating that project had begun and target date would be spring/summer 2023

On June, 24, 2024 PALS met with Todd Jones, Kelvin Kennedy, Bryan Orange, Stacey Swindall and other to review progress on the new PALS web based data base. There has been good progress made on the new data base. PALS and ALDOT will meet again in the upcoming months to review application.

Christy Waddell, State Adopt-a-Mile Coordinator, has implemented several new items for maintaining compliance, updates, and correspondence with current and future Adopt-a-Mile participating groups. One is a brochure (enclosed) that will be sent to each adoptee upon their 2-year anniversary with the program. This will indicate if the group still intends to actively participate or be removed from the active roll. Christy is also working to identify additional miles from past years that are not actively participating or are in need of new and updated signage.

The 2024 "Don't Drop it on Alabama" Statewide Cleanup

The 2024 Spring Cleanup began in April 2024, with some counties and municipalities extending their respective cleanups into May, June and July 2023. PALS will continue to work with the Association of County Commissions to continue cleanups in 65 counties.

Over 500 tons have reported as picked up during the 2024 cleanup effort to date, with several counties completing cleanup efforts in July. Reports are still being received and PALS will work with each city, county or volunteer group to give them additional time to participate if needed.

All materials and supplies were distributed statewide for the 2024 Spring Cleanup

In 2023, the Alabama Community College Systems partnered with local communities to extend the cleanup of all ACCS campuses and respective communities. This partnership continued in 2024.

PALS had to order additional bags for the 2024 statewide cleanup effort due to higher than normal demand for materials and supplies.

PALS / ALDOT Public Service Announcement

The NEW 2024 PALS/ALDOT PSA through ABA began airtime in June, July and August 2024.

As in past years, air time and scheduling reports from the ABA will be included in ALDOT reports for that time period.

PALS has uploaded the new ALDOT anti-littering PSA on the PALS webpage and Facebook page.

Database for Adopt-a-Mile Program (updated emailed to Stacey Swindall and Bryan Orange)

The Adopt-a-Mile database is now current and working effectively. PALS is currently able to view total, exact number of groups and adopted miles by County, State and Federal miles. PALS continues to work with Todd Jones of ALDOT to ensure that the database is working correctly and enabling PALS to best use the database for the benefit of the AAM program.

PALS continues to provide all database updates to ALDOT on a quarterly basis.

PALS continues to add/delete and change information to the new Adopt-a-Mile database as updated information is collected. In addition to daily attention to the database, a file system has been created and maintained to assist in the creation of an accurate account of all County, State and Federal adopted miles in the future.

2024 Adopt-a-Mile Inspections

The internship program has proven highly effective and will continue each year as specified in the PALS / ALDOT contract.

All new data from the Intern AAM Inspection Program reports will be added to the PALS/ AAM database, reflecting and changes, additions, or deletions from current database.

The South Zone will be the focus for the 2023 Inspection program.

The 2023 Adopt A Mile inspections have been completed and were inspected by Osprey Initiative, which is a partner of Alabama PALS and employs college graduates and students that are completing their Masters degree at South Alabama University etc. The inspections in the South Zone were completed in early September 2023 and are included on the enclosed updated data base. A high level of focus was placed on inspecting and rating each mile, but Osprey also focused on old or signs that need to be removed or updated. Pictures of all miles were submitted to PALS, as well as a litter rating for the respective miles.

The partnership with Osprey proved to be the most effective and thorough inspection to date.

PALS will inspect all adopted miles in the Central Zone in 2024, and will be inspected by Osprey Initiative, as was the case in 2023. Inspection of all Central Zone miles will be completed by August 2024.

Thank you ADCNR/State Lands/Coastal Section for your partnership, support, and leadership during these 37 years, and thank you PCI for your devoted stewardship as Title Sponsor for this most successful coastal effort each year. EDUCATING STUDENTS THROUGH

CLEAN CAMPUS PROGRAM

Spring is my favorite time of year! Fresh blooms and the promise of warmer weather make my heart happy. At PALS, spring means it is time for our "Don't Drop it on Alabama" Spring Cleanup, Earth Day events, and contest due dates for our poster and recycled art contests. These annual events serve as a reminder of what we should be doing all year ... looking for ways to keep Alabama cleaner and more beautiful every day!

One way that we work toward keeping Alabama more beautiful all year long is by educating students about litter through the Clean Campus Program. We normally visit around 50 schools each year to spread the anti-litter message and encourage schools to take action against litter. Two schools I met with recently were Southside High School in Etowah County and Hanceville Elementary School in Cullman County.

At Southside High School, I spoke with three different environmental science classes in 10th-12th grades. These students did not just hear the message, they put their ideas into action by conducting a local cleanup (as

pictured). PALS provided the bags for this cleanup, and we are happy to supply bags to your local schools for any cleanups they would like to conduct.

At Hanceville Elementary School, I visited with a group of 120 first graders and encouraged them to start early making good habits when it comes to litter. They learned why litter is "bad," and how they can make a difference even at a very young age. They were also the recipients of newly printed PALS anti-litter coloring books!

As I mentioned earlier, our Poster and Recycled Art Contests are due April 19th. The Poster Contest theme this year is "From the Hills to the Shore, No More Litter in 2024!" DON'T DROP IT ON ALABAMA: COMMUNITY COLLEGES TAKE LEAD IN LITTER PICKUPS

In a significant stride toward a cleaner and greener state, the annual Alabama PALS "Don't Drop It On Alabama" Statewide Spring Cleanup reached record achievements this year.

The initiative, known for rallying community members across Alabama to combat litter and promote recycling, led to greater participation from Alabama's community and technical colleges. This is thanks to Coca-Cola Bottling Company UNITED, Paths for Success, and a new partnership with the Alabama Association of Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Councils.

The Alabama Community College System collected more than 18,377 pounds (nine tons) of trash, debris, and recyclables in 2024. This represents a 67% increase from the previous year's total of 11,000 pounds (5.5 tons).







Specifics as Related to the Contract October 1, 2023-September 30, 2025 Fourth Quarter Reporting Period 07/01/2024 –09/30/2024

The contract for 2023-2025 between Alabama PALS and ALDOT was finalized and received by Alabama PALS in July 2023 and includes components which both parties feel will best benefit the growth and maintenance of these valuable statewide programs.

ALDOT and PALS have made final changes to a new and more information specific database, which will be kept and updated by Alabama PALS. (See Database Below). This database upgrade has afforded PALS a better and more efficient way in which to monitor compliance for the program, keep better contact with the volunteer adoptees, as well as beginning and creating and implementing a new and efficient inspection process for the program.

All new data received from this point forward should reflect accurate information for each adopted mile. The database is now updated with the ability to view exact numbers and locations of State, Federal, and County adopted miles. (Total miles and groups included in report).

PALS continues to receive high level of responses and new applications (see attachments) for Adopt-a-Mile and Adopt-a-Stream programs during the Fourth Quarter of 2023-2024. A new Compliance Reporting Form has been included in the PALS / Adopt-a-Mile Newsletter, where groups, individuals, PALS Chapters and others can report a group that is not keeping their respective mile of highway cleaned on a regular basis.

2023 Alabama PALS Statewide Governor's Awards Program

The 2023 Governor's Awards Program was held on November 08, 2023. Over 260 leaders, state agency heads, volunteers, city and county representatives attended the 2023 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards Program. 34 Awards were presented.

The 2024 Alabama PALS Governor's Awards are scheduled for November 12, 2024.

New Adoptees and Miles Adopted 4/01/24-06/30//24 (see Attached List)

List of AAM applications and signs erected is attached to this report. Reports for all applications, signs mailed and erected are included in each quarterly report.

2023-24 was the fastest growing AAM period to date.

New ALDOT specified Safety Vests are available for all adoptees on State and Federal highways, and notices have been sent to all AAM participants regarding the availability of vests.

Adopt-a-Mile Signs to be Replaced

PALS continues to send letters to ALDOT District Engineers regarding the replacement of respective signs for each district, and will continue to follow up on future sign replacement as the requests come into the PALS office. As data is updated and added to the new AAM database, Christy will continue to correspond with all ALDOT district office in regard to removal or replacement of AAM signs. Several signs have been replaced during this period.

ALDOT District Correspondence

PALS remains in touch with ALDOT District Offices regarding the new protocol for the Adopta-Mile program. Christy feels like all districts are excited about the protocol for the program and feel like having PALS handle all paperwork and signage enables the adoptees to receive the signs in a timely fashion.

Ongoing contact is made with respective District Offices regarding applications, paperwork and erecting of AAM signs. District Offices of ALDOT have been very willing to assist the PALS office in all aspects.

PALS would like to encourage all ALDOT offices to report to the PALS office, all miles that appear to be picked up on a regular basis, or signs that have faded and become unable to read. PALS will contact the respective group.

Proposal for Updating Adopt-a-Mile Procedures

PALS met with Stacey Swindall in late September 2022 to discuss the need to have all AAM documents and applications accepted with signatures for E-sign program. All documents would be emailed to groups and individuals for E-signatures, then emailed to all ALDOT District Engineers for E-Signature, therefore eliminating documents having to be mailed and eliminating paperwork for ALDOT Engineers. This would also speed up time for the volunteers to receive their AAM signs in the future.

Also discussed during meeting was the need to go to a web-based database for the Adopt-a-Mile Program for the future. PALS has discussed this with Todd Jones with ALDOT and can be developed for future use.

Stacy Swindall is working with PALS to move both of these proposals forward.

PALS met with Stacey Swindall on July 7, 2022, to discuss new wordage on all new AAM applications, as well as moving ahead with proposed Docusign use on AAM applications in the future. Upon final approval, PALS will make all necessary changes to have the forms and applications emailed to ALDOT engineers using Docusign to aid in the elimination of paperwork, as well as speed up the application process for volunteer groups.

The discussion also included the use of ALDOT spec safety vests for volunteer use during cleanups held on US and State Highways. PALS will order the ALDOT spec vests moving forward.

During the meeting, Todd Jones with ALDOT updated the attendees of the positive attributes of going to a web based database for the Adopt-a-Mile program. The project will move forward with input from PALS and ALDOT, and the new database should be completed by early summer of 2023.

Todd Jones / ALDOT gave an update of web-based database for Alabama PALS through and email to Stacey Swindall and PALS staff in August 2022 stating that project had begun and target date would be spring/summer 2023

On June, 24, 2024 PALS met with Todd Jones, Kelvin Kennedy, Bryan Orange, Stacey Swindall and other to review progress on the new PALS web based data base. There has been good progress made on the new data base. PALS and ALDOT will meet again in the upcoming months to review application.

Christy Waddell, State Adopt-a-Mile Coordinator, has implemented several new items for maintaining compliance, updates, and correspondence with current and future Adopt-a-Mile participating groups. One is a brochure (enclosed) that will be sent to each adoptee upon their 2-year anniversary with the program. This will indicate if the group still intends to actively participate or be removed from the active roll. Christy is also working to identify additional miles from past years that are not actively participating or are in need of new and updated signage.

The 2024 "Don't Drop it on Alabama" Statewide Cleanup

The 2024 Spring Cleanup began in April 2024, with some counties and municipalities extending their respective cleanups into May, June and July 2023. PALS will continue to work with the Association of County Commissions to continue cleanups in 65 counties.

Over 500 tons have reported as picked up during the 2024 cleanup effort to date, with several counties completing cleanup efforts in July. Reports are still being received and PALS will work with each city, county or volunteer group to give them additional time to participate if needed.

All materials and supplies were distributed statewide for the 2024 Spring Cleanup

In 2023, the Alabama Community College Systems partnered with local communities to extend the cleanup of all ACCS campuses and respective communities. This partnership continued in 2024.

PALS had to order additional bags for the 2024 statewide cleanup effort due to higher than normal demand for materials and supplies.

The NEW 2024 PALS/ALDOT PSA through ABA began airtime in June, July and August 2024.

As in past years, air time and scheduling reports from the ABA will be included in ALDOT reports for that time period.

PALS has uploaded the new ALDOT anti-littering PSA on the PALS webpage and Facebook page.

Database for Adopt-a-Mile Program (updated emailed to Bryan Orange and Ashley Brown)

The Adopt-a-Mile database is now current and working effectively. PALS is currently able to view total, exact number of groups and adopted miles by County, State and Federal miles. PALS continues to work with Todd Jones of ALDOT to ensure that the database is working correctly and enabling PALS to best use the database for the benefit of the AAM program.

PALS continues to provide all database updates to ALDOT on a quarterly basis.

PALS continues to add/delete and change information to the new Adopt-a-Mile database as updated information is collected. In addition to daily attention to the database, a file system has been created and maintained to assist in the creation of an accurate account of all County, State and Federal adopted miles in the future.

2024 Adopt-a-Mile Inspections (2024 Central Zone Inspections Attached)

The internship program has proven highly effective and will continue each year as specified in the PALS / ALDOT contract.

All new data from the Intern AAM Inspection Program reports will be added to the PALS/ AAM database, reflecting and changes, additions, or deletions from current database.

The 2024 Adopt A Mile inspections have been completed and were inspected by Osprey Initiative, which is a partner of Alabama PALS and employs college graduates and students that are completing their Masters degree at South Alabama University etc. The inspections in the Central Zone were completed in early September 2024 and are included on the enclosed updated data base. A high level of focus was placed on inspecting and rating each mile, but Osprey also focused on old or signs that need to be removed or updated. Pictures of all miles were submitted to PALS, as well as a litter rating for the respective miles.

The partnership with Osprey proved to be the most effective and thorough inspection to date.

PALS will inspect all adopted miles in the North Zone in 2025, and will be inspected by Osprey Initiative, as was the case in 2024. Inspection of all North Zone miles will be completed by August 2025.

AGREEMENT

BETWEEN KEEP ALABAMA BEAUTIFUL (KALB) AND THE STATE OF ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORATION (ALDOT)

This agreement is made and entered into by and between the State of Alabama, (acting by and through the Alabama Department of Transportation), hereinafter referred to as ALDOT; and Keep Alabama Beautiful, hereinafter referred to KALB, for the purpose of providing public promotion of the ALDOT anti-litter program.

A. KALB agrees to provide the following:

- 1. Oversee and promote the KALB affiliate network
- Create and maintain a KALB online presence with a website
- Develop and maintain a social media presence via Facebook and Twitter
- Coordinate and notify all KALB affiliates of statewide events including the Great American Cleanup
- Organize and implement programs to increase awareness to reduce littering
- 6. Develop and hold public education events
- 7. Submit quarterly itemized invoices with all supporting documentation, covering actual costs of providing public promotion of the KALB Program
- 8. Provide two part-time employees to be paid by KALB. These employees, along with KALB's Director (State Leader), will serve as liaisons to ALDOT to ensure that the program is fully serviced to provide exposure statewide, as well as ensuring that maximum compliance of the program is serviced including the following:
 - a) Keep Alabama Beautiful Director
 - b) Keep Alabama Beautiful Affiliate Coordinator
- 9. The employees listed in Section 8 shall also:
 - a) Oversee the Keep Alabama Beautiful education and cleanup events
 - b) Perform annual site visits to KALB affiliates
 - c) Keep records of all KALB cleanup events and education events to include specifics on number of volunteers, volume of litter collected, volume of recyclables collected, list of material collected for recycling, number of education events held, number of volunteers assisting with education events, number of adult attendees, number of student attendees. These lists shall be submitted on a collective statewide basis, unless otherwise requested by ALDOT.

- d) Provide quarterly updates to ALDOT on new KALB affiliates and any KALB affiliates that become inactive
- e) Recruit new KALB affiliates to maximize the number of cleanups across the state and increase the awareness and education programs parameters
- 10. Provide a written quarterly report to ALDOT of KALB activities to include:
 - a) List of cleanups held, volumes of litter collected, number of volunteers, list of partner organizations
 - b) List of education events held, number of volunteers, list of partner organizations, number of attendees
 - c) List of new KALB affiliates, inactivated affiliates, etc.
 - d) List of all public service announcements that air to include air schedules
 - e) List of all billboard messages and locations
 - 11. Provide safety vests in accordance with ALDOT's most current Guidelines for Operations (latest adopted version), for all individuals participating in cleanup events and participating in other KALB activities where litter will be removed. KALB will also be responsible for informing all participants that safety vests should be worn when they are picking up litter. KALB is also responsible for making sure that KALB affiliates are aware that Hold Harmless documents should be signed and maintained by KALB affiliates holding cleanup events.

B. ALDOT agrees to provide the following:

- 1. Oversee KALB oversight and promotion of the affiliate network
- 2. Provide litterbags for KALB participants as required
- 3. Provide removal and disposal of litter collected by KALB participants as required
- 4. Reimburse KALB a maxim for the fiscal year in accordance with the proposed budget listed below:

C. Funds shall not be constituted as a debt:

It is agreed that the terms and commitments contained herein shall not be constituted as a debt of the State of Alabama in violation of Article 11, Section 213 of the Constitution of Alabama 1901, as amended by Amendment Number 26. It is further agreed that if any provision of this Agreement shall contravene any statute or Constitutional provision of amendment, either now in effect of which may, during the course of this Agreement, be enacted, then the conflicting provision in the Agreement shall be deemed null and void.

D. Termination due to Insufficient funds:

- If the Agreement term is to exceed more than one fiscal year, then said Agreement is subject to termination in the event that funds should not be appropriated for the continued payment of the Agreement in subsequent fiscal years.
- 2. In the event of proration of the fund, from which payment under this Agreement is to be made, Agreement will be subject to termination.
- 3. This Agreement can be terminated by either party upon thirty days written notice to the other party.

E. Dispute Resolution:

In the event of any dispute between the parties, senior officials of both parties shall meet and engage in a good faith attempt to resolve the dispute. Should that effort fail, and the dispute involves the payment of money, a party's sole remedy is the filing of a claim with the Board of Adjustment of the State of Alabama. For any other disputes arising under the terms of this Agreement which are not resolved by negotiation, the parties agree to utilize appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution including, but not limited to, mediation. Such dispute resolution shall occur in Montgomery, Alabama utilizing where appropriate, mediators selected from the roster of mediators maintained by the Center for Dispute Resolution of the Alabama State Bar.

F. Hold Harmless:

KALB, its employees, agents, affiliates, successors, assigned, contractors, or subcontractors shall defend indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, Department of Transportation and their officials, employees, contractors, servants, or

agents, in both their officials, employees, contractors, servants, or agents, in both their official and individual capacities, from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, actions, causes of actions, losses or expenses of any nature whatsoever, regulatory actions, administrative actions, quasi-administrative or quasi-judicial actions or procedures, State, Federal, or otherwise, of any nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, including but not limited to compensatory damages, punitive damages, damages for any injury to person or property, tangible or intangible, or any form of monetary or compensatory relief declaratory or injunctive relief, or any nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, or attorney fees, costs, or expenses, caused by or rising out of, resulting from or in any way related to the performance of any work, conduct or activity performed or failed to be performed by KALB in connection with the performance of any of the provisions of this Agreement.

G. Non-Agent Clause:

By entering into this agreement, KALB is not an agent of the State, its officers, employees, agents or assigns. KALB is an independent entity from the State and nothing in this agreement creates an agency relationship between the parties.

H. Merit Law:

KALB employees and affiliates will not be subject to the provisions of, nor entitled to, the benefits of the State merit law or State employee benefits, including State employee health insurance.

I. Information and Reports:

KALB will permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as may be determined by the ALDOT to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with its instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, KALB shall so certify to ALDOT and shall set forth what efforts he has made to obtain the information.

J. Certificate of Compliance with ACT 2016-312:

In compliance with Act 2016-312, the Contractor is not currently engaged in, and will not engage in, the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with which this state can enjoy open trade.

K. Immigration Clause:

By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.

L. Period of Agreement:

THIS AGREEMENT is in effect for the period beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2025.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto cause this agreement to be executed by those officers, officials, and persons thereunto duly authorized, and the agreement is deemed to be effective on the date stated hereinafter as the date of the approval of the Governor of Alabama.

"Trash Talk", not voiced by WJOX personalities, also aired on iheartmedia stations as a PSA during the time period.

The video component of "Trash Talk" with a football theme began airing via digital and cable stations as well as on streaming channels. The annual "Thankful" campaign also aired on strategically selected cable and streaming channels with a diverse viewership during portions of November and December. The two versions of "Thankful" commercials and "Trash Talk" aired 1,735 times during the Quarter.
